**Second Reminder!** UW Extension Fiscal Year 2012 On-Line Reports, which gather data on time and contacts for October 1, 2011 – September 30, 2012, need to be completed for **ALL** Extension Employees (field educators and state specialists) by **October 5, 2012**. The system we use has to be manually rolled over to the new fiscal year October 1<sup>st</sup> – to facilitate this we are allowing employees a few days into October to complete these reports. #### Customer Service Tip

Think of your Extension office as a "small business" and treat your customers as if your business depended on them. Be sure that the office reflects a positive image of the kind of "business" you are in. Evaluate your office from a "first impressions" standpoint. If it doesn't measure up, plan a housekeeping day when you and your staff will spiffy up the office. Be aware and diligent about "visual signals" that send the wrong messages to customers about the educational work we do. These might include dead plants around the office (not a horticultural "best management practice"), use of junk food or junk food wrappers lying around (not the best nutrition message), or cluttered, unorganized offices ("How can they find my answer in that mess?")

# Cent\$ible Nutrition News from Mary Kay:

#### **CNP-sters Return**

With the "FAIR-ly" busy August for many of you, here is a quick way to keep getting veggies:

#### Panned Carrots and Cabbage

In a large skillet on the stove heat 1 Tablespoon of canola oil. Add  $\frac{1}{2}$  of a chopped onion and cook 1 minute. Add 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  cups grated carrots and 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  cups grated (or thinly sliced) cabbage. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cover tightly and steam about 5-8 minutes.

(MK's addition – sprinkle with some chili powder for a nice pop of flavor).
