The potentially harmful effects of exposure to pesticides:


→ Can induce a range of possible symptoms and outcomes including "nothing" to "you could die."

When handling application equipment, limit exposure to pesticide residues by:

- → Wearing waterproof gloves.
- → Wearing additional PPE as needed, for example, safety glasses, coveralls, and rubber boots.

Follow these personal hygiene practices and decontamination procedures for preventing pesticide exposures and removing pesticide residues:

- → Wash your hands before eating, drinking, smoking, or using the toilet.
- → Since clothing may become contaminated, wash it separately from other clothing.
- → Leave work boots outside.
