Quick Presentation Tips

> Practice your presentation. A lot. If you are entering impromptu practice general speaking in front of people. If you are using scientific terms or complex words make sure you are pronouncing them correctly.

> The state contest will be held in a hotel ballroom. There will be two tables, easels, and a computer/projector for the presenter to use during the prepared contest. There will be no equipment or tables during the impromptu contest. If you require special equipment plan on bringing it. There will be seating for parents and guests in the back of the room with the judges sitting in the front. There will be two judges for each age group.

> Make sure to check in at the contest table when you arrive at the contest. If they don't know that you are there they may think you didn't come and skip you.

> Note cards may be used for prepared presentations, but make sure not to be relying on those notes or reading from them. One notecard will be provided for each impromptu presentation.

> If there is a room host who introduces your name or presentation topic you don't need to repeat that information to the judges when you start your presentation. Practice both ways and be ready to adjust.

> Make sure the judges are done writing notes from the previous presenter, are ready, and are focused on you before you start speaking.

> Make sure you have a catchy introduction and a solid conclusion to your presentation.

> Once you start talking the room host will begin timing your speech. They will stop timing when your speech ends. Time answering questions is not included in your presentation time.

> Make eye contact with the judges. Make sure you are speaking clearly so they can understand you. Don't look at the floor, put your notes in front of your face, or turn away when speaking because the judges won't be able to hear you.

> When you are finished presenting always ask the judges if they have questions. Most judges will have a question or two for you about your topic. Make sure you study your topic so you can answer the questions. If you don't know the answer admit it; all you need to say is that you didn't learn that in your research. Never make up an answer.

> Thank the judges when you are finished with your questions.

- Show your confidence. You are an expert on the topic you are speaking about so don't be afraid to show it.
- > Awards will be presented the night after the contest at the banquet so try to arrange to stick around.
- > If you have questions, please ask! You can always contact the contest chairman or the state 4-H office.

Suggested time length for juniors 3-7 minutes, intermediate is 5-10 minutes and 7-15 minutes for senior age youth. (Junior 8-10, Intermediate 11-13, Senior 14-19). A child's age is based on January 1 of the current 4-H year. Please call if you have questions.



Albany County Fair Requirements

All rabbits shown at Albany County Fair must have a permanent tattoo in their left ear. Ink pen or marker tattoos are not acceptable on rabbit entries. If you need help tattooing your rabbits, please contact Freda Dixon, and she will help you get your animals tattooed. Rabbits for breeding classes must be owned by June 1, 2017. Does producing a meat pen must be owned by April 15, 2017. Rabbits under 6 weeks of age will not be permitted on the fairgrounds.

Rabbit Meat Pen and Single Fryer for 2017

Rabbits must be 70 days or less in age as of show day. The rabbits must weigh between 3-1/2 and 5-1/2 pounds in weight on show day. You are limited to two entries per exhibitor. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell one meat pen at the Albany County Livestock Sale if the judge deems the pen "marketable". The limit of two animals of different species per consignor is still in effect.



- Know the pledge and the motto. Be able to explain it.
- Stay informed: club happenings and county happenings. Newsletters/mailings/e-mail.
- Come to the meetings. Come to the meetings ready to roll. Be an active
 - member, not a passive one.
- Help other members—be supportive, encouraging and helpful.
- Be aware of deadlines and rules and observe them.
- Stay in touch with your Club leaders and Project leaders -don't wait for them to call.
- When a Project leader holds a meeting, BE there.
- Actively look for opportunities to help and lead.
- Do at least one well-prepared speech or demonstration or presentation at the club level every year, and then do that same one at county presentation day.
- Take advantage of, and make it a priority, to participate in 4-H events throughout the year, and beyond the county level.
- Complete and submit the 4-H Record Book (s) every year! It will pay off!





Calculating Market Weight

Use the following formula to determine how much weight your market animal should be gaining in order to meet the weight requirements for county fair:

- Determine the number of days until weigh-ins on Tuesday, August 1st
- Determine the average daily gain
 - Sheep: 0.5 0.75 pounds per day
 - Swine: 1.5 2.0 pounds per day

- Beef: 2.5 2.8 pounds per day
- Goat: .2 .3 pounds per day
- Determine the target finishing weight (what you want your animal to weigh at county fair)
 - Sheep: min. weight for co. fair = 100#, no max
 - Swine: min weight for co. fair = 220#, no max
- Goat: min. weight for co fair = 50#, max. = 150#
- Beef: 22.5 lbs./inch hip height w/ 2% allowance on low end
- •Example: You attend the June 1st weigh-in. You guess that your pig will gain approximately 1.7 pounds per day. There are 59 days until county fair weigh-ins on July 30th. On that day you would like your pig to weigh 250 pounds. Now plug in those numbers to the formula to determine what your pig should weigh at the preliminary weigh-in.

(days to co. fair) x (avg. daily gain) = lbs. needed to gain (target finishing weight) - (lbs. to gain) = weight today

- 59 days x 1.7 lbs. per day = 100.3 lbs. to gain 250 lbs. 100.3 = 149.7 weight today
- * Please note: In most circumstances, based on frame score and body condition, a typical market lamb, hog, steer or goat that weighs in at the *minimum* weight for county fair, may not be considered "market ready".

Albany County Fair Information and Changes in 2017

ENTRIES

Albany County 4-H/FFA Fair Entries are due <u>Friday July</u> <u>14th, 2017. No late entries will be accepted.</u> Livestock, horse, poultry, dog, cat and rabbit entry forms DO require a parents' signature. Leaders' signatures are not required on project entry forms.

DONATIONS FROM SALE CONSIGNMENTS

Any member wishing to donate to a scholarship fund, a foundation or any other organization MUST do so when they fill out their consignment forms for the sale. You must have complete address and donation information. The auctioneers will not announce donations at the sale, a list of lot numbers with donations published at sale.

CHECK IN / HEALTH INSPECTION

Health inspection paperwork will be checked at a check station inside the north gate. <u>Animals need to enter the fairgrounds through the North Gate</u>. All animals, including horses must have been inspected within 10 days of arriving on grounds. Rabbits must be within 72 hours. Animals may be checked in from 8:00am to 8:00 pm on Monday. Animals must be on the grounds and checked in by 8:00 pm. Horse, rabbit and poultry exhibitors must check in with the superintendent.

STALL ASIGNMENTS AND DECORATIONS

The livestock barns will be open Sunday at Noon for stall decorating. Dogs for Dog show on Sunday will be housed in South End of Swine Barn so please be respectful and patient. Stall assignments will be posted at that time.

NEW BEEF CLASSES

Two new classes have been added to the market beef classes. They are "Albany County Owned" in which a member raises a steer or market heifer from their own families (parent or grand parent's) herd. The second is "Albany County Raised" in which a member raises a market steer or heifer that was purchased from an Albany County producer.

MINIATURE HEREFORDS

J-2-2 Market Miniature Hereford

 Market animals must be steers or open heifers. Heifers must be preg checked with supreme heifers on Tuesday of fair and confirmed open or have a letter from Vet. certifying the heifer is open.. Market animals must be dehorned.

 Animals must have been tagged with a Wyoming State Fair ear tag at the weigh date in January to be eligible to show at this fair. 3 To qualify for the Miniature Hereford class the maximum hip height is 46 inches and the maximum weight is 1000 pounds. Animals who exceed these maximum qualifications will fall under the market beef qualifications. STRIP RIBBONS

Strip ribbons will not be given in livestock classes this year. Rosette's will still be awarded but the strip ribbons will not.

BICYCLES ON FAIRGROUNDS

There will be no bicycles allowed at the fairgrounds during fair.

WEIGHT VARIANCE

There will be NO weight variance allowed on any species of animals.

PANELS AND NECK ROPES FOR BEEF

No panels in the beef tie outs. Neck ropes must be used on all animals in the beef tie outs.

FITTING, FEEDING AND PROJECT PREPERATION All participants in the Albany County Fair must be involved and interact in the daily care and preparation of their fair projects. We understand that 4-H and FFA are family oriented organizations and help may be needed. Please use common sense when caring for and/or preparing your projects at fair. If you have questions please consult your superintendent in that area.

LIVESTOCK RELEASE

Livestock will be released on Friday after the round robin, <u>OR</u> Sunday before Noon. There will be no load out on Sat. due to sale and transporting sale animals.

MARKET HEIFERS

Market Heifers must be spayed. pregnancy checked open on grounds or have letter from a licended vetrenarian stating heifer has been pregnancy checked and is open to be eligible to exhibit. (Market Heifers will be checked at the same time as Supreme Heifers, please check schedule)

SHEEP LEAD

We are having a sheep lead as part of family night this year. Open to all Albany County residents. Sheep lead is designed to promote the wool and sheep industry.

DOG SHOW


All dog show classes will be on Sunday, including agility and rally.
