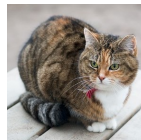

EXPLORING 4-H AROUND THE WORLD



Exchange Program Overview

Come explore the world with us! You can experience the rich history and culture of Mongolia, Ghana, or Finland. The International 4-H Exchange Programs are designed to advance cultural understanding, spark an interest in learning about other cultures, and develop a cadre of Americans with cultural understanding who can advance international dialogue and live and work effectively in a global society.

Mongolia will be a two way exchange with Americans traveling (outbound) followed by Mongolians visiting the US (inbound). Ghana and Finland will be outbound trips only in the summer of 2019 with the Finns planning on visiting the US in 2020. Each exchange trip will be approximately 2 weeks long - inbound and outbound.

Selection Criteria?

The program is open to current senior aged 4-H members (14-19) interested in traveling internationally, learning about different cultures, and living with a host family. Students will be selected on the following criteria:

- Personal leadership skills
- Social skills - Openness and flexibility
- Interest in learning about different cultures and global issues

- Web video interviews - January 2019
- Pre-trip orientation via web conference - TBD
- Travel dates - June- July 2019.
 - Ghana Tentative dates - mid June
 - Mongolia Tentative dates - late June/early July
 - Finland Tentative dates - Late July (17-31)

How much does it cost?
The cost of each trip is \$2,000 per person. The Wyoming State 4-H Foundation will supplement costs for the host country for the exchange. The following expenses will be included in the trip cost:

- Roundtrip airfare to host country
- Meals and lodging
- In country logistics (i.e. transportation, etc.)
- Travel insurance, Accident and sickness protection

A \$500 deposit will be required upon selection, the remaining balance can be made in monthly payments

There will be some additional out-of-pocket expenses for participants which include:

- Passport & passport photos
- Immunization fees (if required)
- Transportation to and from outbound/inbound airport
- Spending money for souvenirs and other in-country purchases
- In-country site seeing excursions
- Modest host family gift

Record Books-What is the big deal and why should we care about them?

As an adult do you appreciate it when someone keeps their word and follows through with what they said they would do (has integrity)? Do you wish politicians would consider what it is really going to cost to do what they say they want to do, before you get your tax bill? Do you need to track expenses for a business? Or have you ever wanted to do something or learn something new and you still haven't done it?

Making a commitment, making a goal and making a plan as to how to achieve that goal and then recording all that goes into the project and meeting the goal is what a record book is. A record book is also a place to record what things you have done for others. This a great help and resource for students who apply for trips, scholarships, even apply for jobs. And lastly a record book gives you opportunity to summarize your past 4-H creatively through a written story and a picture story.

So the big deal is we want to help kids be the best they can be; to grow to be responsible adults who know how to set realistic goals and make a plan to meet those goals and to count the cost of meeting those goals.

*R*abbit Agility & Hopping

Rabbit Agility and Hopping classes will begin in February. Are you and your rabbit ready to participate?

Ways to tell if your rabbit will make a good agility or hopping rabbit:

- ★ Your rabbit comes to the front of its cage wanting attention
- ★ It loves to explore when it's outside of its cage.
- ★ It is energetic, in its cage or out of its cage.
- ★ It really likes being with you.

Ways to tell if your rabbit would not make a good agility rabbit:

- ★ It acts scared when it is out of its cage.
- ★ It is overweight for its breed.
- ★ It has an impairment like a healed broken leg.
- ★ It wants to hide when you take it out of its cage.
- ★ It always flattens itself and won't move if you put it on a leash.

2019 4-H Carnival

Each club is asked to submit at least two posters to advertise the carnival; however each club is encouraged to submit more than two entries. Posters can be computer generated or hand made and should be **no larger than 11 X 17 inches**. Turn these in to the Extension Office by 5 pm on Friday, February 01, 2019. Posters must be turned in by the deadline in order to be judged. The grand prize within each division (junior, intermediate, senior) will be \$15 and reserve champion will receive \$10. Age divisions are:

- Junior: 8-10 years old as of Jan 1, 2019
- Intermediate: 11-13 years old as of Jan 1, 2019
- Senior: 14 years or older as of Jan 1, 2019

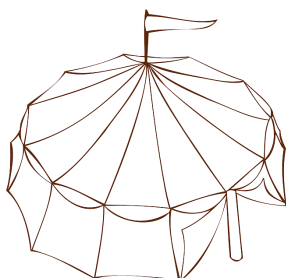
Posters should include:

Cans not following guidelines may not be included in the royalty contest. Cans must have a removable lid so tickets can be counted throughout the day. Cans must be turned in to carnival office by 9:15 am Saturday morning.


