Reading/Approval of Minutes for April were moved to be accepted by Tracy Fletcher, 2nd by Janet Renneisen motion passed.

**Treasurer Report**: Sara Muhsman reported balances in each account. First Interstate account is \$16,244.99 (Entrepreneur Camp expense of \$200 for manuals), American National Bank account is \$6,038.40 (Livestock Judging expense of \$80 for contests), Endowment is \$20,000.00 and Foundation is \$7,082.98.

- -Executive: Met earlier to review submitted Shooting Sports designs and approved both a shirt and hat logo. So many great de signs submitted!
- -Awards: Letters regarding donations for County Fair will be sent out this month. Awards have been ordered.
- -By-laws: Met last month and are making good progress. They will meet again May 22 at 12:00 at Applebee's.
- -Carnival: nothing to report
- -Fund Raising: Weekly Herds assignments have been sent out to all the clubs and herd leaders.
- -Junior Awards Trip: nothing to report
- -Record Book: Presentations at the club meetings are going well. The last 3 are on the schedule for this month. Only 1 club chose not to participate. Held an Open House tonight for record book help, no one attended.
- -Scholarship: Recipients were Trey Muhsman and Kelcey Anderson.
- -4-H Foundation: They will be doing concessions at County Shoot on June 8. They will also be having a dinner fundraiser in Sept. -Junior Leaders: They will be traveling to Ohio for exchange June 21-27. They will be hosting Pennsylvania over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, and then hosting Wisconsin. They will have their Garage Sale on Saturday, June 1. Donations can be brought in after May 28 when the dog show is over. They will not accept any clothing items.

#### **Old Business**

- -Backpack Program: 120-ish backpacks per week being given.
- -Entrepreneur Camp Funding: Mary Louise asked if Council would be willing to pay half or all of the \$35 registration for each 4H member attending, so far there are 4. Meaghan Stinson made a motion to pay full registration for all 4H members attending, se conded by Tracy Fletcher. Motion passed.
- -Murdoch's BBQ: Went well, sold out by 12:30pm. Next one will be June 15.
- -Carnival Cake Walk: It was brought to Council by many different clubs about the possibility of giving all clubs the opportunity to do the Cake Walk booth, instead of only Rock Creek Valley. There was much discussion. There were concerns that all other clubs have to alternate booths and it is not fair. Also, all clubs have to provide cakes without the chance to run the booth. There are many 4H members who would really like the opportunity because it is the most popular and fun booth at carnival. Some clubs were concerned that they have to spend \$50+ on decorations for a new booth every year, while Rock Creek does not. Heather and Mikayla Alexander represented Rock Creek Valley. Heather has confirmed information that they have done this booth since 1975, but there is talk of them having it since 1964. Rock Creek is a small club and it is more than just a booth to them—it is a tradition. They also spend \$50+ adding to their decorations. Many times they get snowed-in in Laramie the night of Carnival. Another point was made that Rock Creek members do not get to attend many of the extra 4H activities we have due to the drive, time, weather, etc. Janet Renneisen made a motion for Rock Creek Valley to continue with the Cake Walk Booth based on tradition, seconded by Meaghan Stinson, unanimously passed.
  - -Feeding Laramie Valley: the representative who asked for 4H involvement in the Higher Grounds Fair no longer works there. If clubs still want to participate, they will have to contact Feeding Laramie Valley directly.

- -Mary Louise let us know Colton Elliott and Tanner Smith just found out they were selected to attend the National 4H Shooting Sports Contest in Grand Island, NE June 23-25. Colette Christensen moved that council award each young man \$150 to help cover expenses, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Nancy Marlatt. Motion passed. Due to the short amount of time they have to raise funds, 4H Council and Foundation members discussed hosting a taco dinner fundraiser in June to assist in raising funds for this and other projects. #### **Sewing Days**



If you are interested in learning how to sew, the next sewing class will be June 15th from 1pm to 4pm in the extension office meeting room. We will have the beginners making an apron or pajama pants. If you want to make pajama pants, we have patterns of all sizes, but we ask you to share your waist and hip measurements (your hip measurement is 7 inches below your waist) when you RSVP so that we have a pattern of your size ready for you. Please select a cotton, cotton blend, or flannel fabric without plaids or stripes. Please no fleece. You will need 2 to 2 5/8 yards of fabric depending on your height. You will also need 1 yard of 3/4 inch elastic and thread to match your fabric. If you want to make an apron, you will need one yard of fabric with coordinating thread.

Please prewash and iron your fabric before you come to the sewing day. If you have a portable sewing machine that you like to use, please bring it. We will have sewing machines for those who do not have one that they can bring. Please also bring your sewing basket with pins, scissors and a seam ripper. Please let us know if you need a sewing machine. Parents are always welcome to attend.

The Intermediate sewers will meet the same day and will work on projects they have selected. If you want help selecting a project, you may contact Freda (742-0506) or Mary Louise (721-2571). We will meet once a month until fair. Please RSVP by June 13th to 307.721.2571 or mwood8@uwyo.edu.



#### **Albany County Fair Requirements**

All rabbits shown at Albany County Fair must have a permanent tattoo in their left ear. Ink pen or marker tattoos are not acceptable on rabbit entries. If you need help tattooing your rabbits, please contact Freda Dixon, and she will help you get your animals tattooed. Rabbits for breeding classes must be owned by June 1, 2019. Does producing a meat pen must be owned by April 15, 2019. Rabbits under 6 weeks of age will not be permitted on the fairgrounds.

#### Rabbit Meat Pen and Single Fryer for 2019

Rabbits must be <u>70 days or less in age</u> as of show day. The rabbits must weigh between <u>3-1/2 and 5-1/2 pounds</u> in weight on show day. You are limited to two entries per exhibitor. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell <u>one</u> meat pen at the Albany County Livestock Sale if the judge deems the pen "marketable". The limit of two animals of different species per consignor is still in effect.

## Youth Deer Hunt

The Wyoming State 4-H Program offers a hunting experience for up to six youth ages 14-18. The hunt takes place in Northeastern Wyoming on the Solitude Ranch. The ranch is located 5 miles east of Devils Tower and features spectacular scenery and lots of wildlife. The hunt is primarily for whitetail doe deer and so far has a 98% success rate and 100% opportunity to harvest.

All 4-H members between 14 and 18 years of age are eligible. Applications will evaluated by a selection committee with preference given to first time hunters and 4-H shooting sports members enrolled in the rifle, pistol, shotgun, archery, muzzle loading, wildlife and/or hunting projects.







# 2019 Cowboy Youth Classic



The 2019 Cowboy Youth Classic featuring beef, goat, hog and lamb fitting and showing clinics will be held **June 14th and 15th** at the Albany County Fairgrounds. Registration for the 2019 Cowboy Youth Classic is now open. Click <u>here</u> to register. All registration will be online this year. We will not be accepting early payments; all payment is expected at check-in (June 14<sup>th</sup>). ## **Calculating Market Weight**

Use the following formula to determine how much weight your market animal should be gaining in order to meet the weight requirements for county fair:

- Determine the number of days until weigh-ins on Tuesday, July 31st
- Determine the average daily gain
  - Sheep: 0.5 0.75 pounds per day
  - Swine: 1.5 2.0 pounds per day

- Beef: 2.5 2.8 pounds per day
- Goat: .2 .3 pounds per day
- Determine the target finishing weight (what you want your animal to weigh at county fair)
  - Sheep: min. weight for co. fair = 100#, no max
  - Swine: min weight for co. fair = 220#, no max
- Goat: min. weight for co fair = 50#, max. = 150#
- Beef: 22.5 lbs./inch hip height w/ 2% allowance on low end
- •Example: You attend the June 1st weigh-in. You guess that your pig will gain approximately 1.7 pounds per day. There are 59 days until county fair weigh-ins on July 30th. On that day you would like your pig to weigh 250 pounds. Now plug in those numbers to the formula to determine what your pig should weigh at the preliminary weigh-in.

(days to co. fair) x (avg. daily gain) = lbs. needed to gain (target finishing weight) - (lbs. to gain) = weight today

59 days x 1.7 lbs. per day = 100.3 lbs. to gain

250 lbs. - 100.3 = 149.7 weight today

\*\* Please note: In most circumstances, based on frame score and body condition, a typical market lamb, hog, steer or goat that weighs in at the *minimum* weight for county fair, may not be considered "market ready".
