## **RECORD BOOK JUDGING!! OCTOBER 13, 14 & 15TH**

Extension Meeting Room, anytime between 8am-8pm

You are free to come and go throughout the day. Parents, past or present leaders, 4-H alumni and other community members who have knowledge of the 4-H program are wanted to help judge record books. REMINDER: Each club is responsible for providing one or more adults to help with record book judging.

## **Upcoming events**



### 2020 District 1: Make It With Wool Contest



The District Contest for the Make It With Wool contest is **TENTATIVELY October 16, 2020**.

- Entries due to Julie Houchin by October 9.
- Contestants must construct a garment for themselves using fabric or yarn that is at least 60% wool.
- This year you are asked to test your fabric using clorox be sure you have a new bottle of clorox, cut a sample approximately 1 1/2 inch by 1 1/2 inch place wool in nonreactive, ceramic bowl, push wool to the bottom of the bowl to assure saturation and full immersion. Observe swatch occasionally for several hours, (at least 12 hours) push the wool to the bottom of the bowl again to be sure full contact with the liquid. You will observe a substantial foaming reaction over the first few hours as the wool fiber is neutralized, depending on weight of wool, after a few hours the foam will leave the surface, and there should be no distinguishable fibers if the wool is 100% wool.
- Entry forms are online and you MUST send swatches to the District Director (Julie) and the State Director will also have to test the wool using this method. Samples must be 4" x 4" of fabric or 24" yarn. Entries must be sent in as soon as possible.
- The winners of the District contest in the Adult, Senior and Junior divisions will advance to the State Contest in CASPER,
   DECEMBER 6-7, 2020, RAMKOTA HOTEL
- All Adult contestants may participate at the State contest. To be eligible, contestants must compete at a district contest first.
- The National Office is no longer providing the 3 part carbon entry forms. The forms are available on the national website at: makeitwithwool.com
- Contestants will need to make 3 copies, one to National Director address on the form, one to State Director, Carol Macy, PO Box 428, Pine Bluffs, WY 82082 and one to the District Director, Julie Houchin 1801 W Hill Road, Laramie, WY 82072.

Because of Covid19 I will not be asking merchants for prizes, you will receive a piece of wool however and sewing notions. It is important if you are a winner you agree to go to the state contest. Numbers at state have been down and unless they increase the possibility of MIWW in Wyoming could be jeopardized. Please read all the rules and regulations online!

#### POKES MAKING THE FUTURE

Announcing our new Pokes Making the Future after-school (hybrid) program focused on machine learning and making. This program is aimed at **youth age 11 to 15 years old, and requires 50% female participation for the program to launch, so invite your friends and sisters**. The projects in this program build upon each other, exposing youth to coding with Arduino and build circuits with conductive thread. The program culminates with the completion of a larger final project that the youth work on for several weeks incorporating machine learning and coding. The program starts **October 8th and lasts for 7 weeks, meeting via zoom weekly on Thursday's from 3:30PM – 6PM**, with one in-person (small group) session (3hr) during the last two weeks of the program. The cost is \$40 per youth, with scholarships available to those who qualify. Project kits will need to be picked up by registered youth prior to the start date.

During this seven week program youth will make the following projects using the LilyPad E-textile Arduino:

- LED e-textile Mask
- LED e-textile and Vinyl Trick or Treat Bags
- LED e-textile Arduino Programmed and Embroidered Hat and/or T-shirt


