- <u>**Remember to practice sewing a seam and</u> <u>threading your machine before you come to the class</u> <u>if you have a sewing machine at home.</u>

Rabbit IDs

Rabbit IDs are due June 1 to the extension office. You must list all rabbits that you own to have the opportunity to bring your rabbit to fair.

Albany County Fair Requirements:

All rabbits shown in breeding classes at Albany County Fair must have a permanent tattoo in their left ear and be vaccinated for RHDV2. NO EXCEPTIONS!!! Rabbits for breeding classes must be owned by June 1, 2021. Does producing a meat pen must be owned by April 15, 2021.

Rabbit Meat Pen and Single Fryer for 2021:

Rabbits must be <u>70 days or less in age</u> as of show day. The rabbits must weigh between <u>3 1/2 and 5 1/2 pounds</u> in weight on show day. You are limited to two entries per exhibitor. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell one meat pen or single fryer at the Albany County Livestock Sale if the judge deems the pen "marketable". The limit of two animals of different species per consignor is still in effect. This is a terminal show. All market rabbits will be butchered or donated to the birds to help stop the spread of RHDV2.

Vaccine Clinic

The last RHDV2 Vaccine Clinic will be held Saturday July 24th These rabbits will be fully vaccinated by Show Day, August 2nd. If you want to participate in this clinic, contact Freda (760-9728) to put your name on a waiting list. There is a limited number of doses available

Community Service Spotlight

Albary County 4-H Community Service Committee

is excited to recognize 4-H members who are doing community services and volunteering in Albany County! This month we are featuring...

4-H rabbit project members were not able to participate in live show events in 2020 due to a fatal virus called Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus - Type 2 (RHDV2). This virus is highly contagious in both domestic and wild rabbits; but serves as no threat to humans. Out of an abundance of caution, live rabbits were not permitted to participate in the 4-H Rabbit Show, Rabbit Agility, or in the Junior Livestock Sale because RHDV2 was found in northern Colorado. This disease is highly contagious, and it is nearly always fatal. Vaccinating domestic rabbits annually is the only way to ensure protection against RHDV2.

On May 1st, Alpine Animal Hospital hosted a RHDV2 vaccine clinic for rabbit enthusiasts across Wyoming. 4-H members and Rabbit Project participants, Dax Evertson and **Emerson Vohland** volunteered to assist with the event. Their work included setting up and manning a check-in table, ensuring that shoes were treated with a bleach solution prior to entry into the facility, and examination cleaning areas between groups. They photocopied vaccine records and brought rabbits to the examining tables for veterinary exams. Dax and Emerson pitched in wherever they were needed and ultimately helped

A huge "Thank You" goes out to veterinarian Dana Peterson for her hard work and dedication to helping keep our rabbits safe from RH2DV. Without her efforts, our 4-H community would not have live rabbit events

at the 2021 Albany County Fair.



Hello / Welcome our symmer intern. Taylor !



My name is Taylor Ruckman and I am serving as the Albany County Extension Summer Intern. I have been working for 4-H since I graduated from high school in 2017. I was a member for 10 years and completed projects in rabbit and swine showmanship, sewing, fashion review, cooking, visual arts, photography, junior leadership, and archery. I participated in 4-H National Conference where I served on a youth panel for NASA, and in a 4-H sponsored trip to Finland where I learned about how 4-H operates in different countries. Since then, I have helped plan 4-H camps and workshops for fashion, cooking, showmanship, produce judging, and creative writing. I am so excited to be back this summer to share my knowledge with our members and to learn from all of you! Let's have a great 4-H season serving our clubs, our community, our country, and our world.

Calculating Market Weight

Use the following formula to determine how much weight your market animal should be gaining in order to meet the weight requirements for county fair:

- Determine the number of days until weigh-ins on Monday, August 2nd
- Determine the average daily gain
 - Sheep: 0.5 0.75 pounds per day
 - Swine: 1.5 2.0 pounds per day
- Beef: 2.5 2.8 pounds per day
- Goat: .2 .3 pounds per day
- Determine the target finishing weight (what you want your animal to weigh at county fair)
 - Sheep: min. weight for co. fair = 100#, no max
 - Swine: min weight for co. fair = 220#, max 325#
- Goat: min. weight for co fair = 50#, max. = 150#
- Beef: 22.5 lbs./inch hip height
- **Example:** You attend the May 29th 1st weigh-in. You guess that your pig will gain approximately 1.7 pounds per day. There are 64 days until county fair weigh-ins on Aug. 2nd. On that day you would like your pig to weigh 250 pounds. Now plug in those numbers to the formula to determine what your pig should weigh at the preliminary weigh-in:
 - (days to co. fair) x (avg. daily gain) = lbs. needed to gain \rightarrow 64 days x 1.7 lbs. per day = 108.8 lbs to gain
 - (target finishing weight) (lbs. to gain) = weight today \rightarrow 250 lbs 108.8 = 141.2 weight today

** Please note: In most circumstances, based on frame score and body condition, a typical market lamb, hog, steer or goat that weighs in at the *minimum* weight for county fair, may not be considered "market ready".


