FIND YOUR SPARK IN 4-H



It is October, the start of a new 4-H year, a time to start setting goals and making plans for the next 4-H year. This translates into starting your record book...

When you say the 4-H pledge you pledge (A solemn binding promise to do, give, or refrain from doing something) your head to clearer thinking. One great way to do that is to put on paper and write down your goals and your plan(s) to meet them. Studies show that true leaders have goals and have steps defined how to meet those goals.

Record Keeping is a life skill. An employee needs to record the number of hours they work, an employer needs to keep track of expenses and profits, a US citizen needs to file a tax return. All these tasks require record keeping. Record books are a great resource to help with learning how to set goals, and track progress and document what has occurred. Good Job to all 4-Hers on completing the 2020-2021 4-H year and turning in your record books! Start this year off right by starting your project report now, make those goals and write them down! And keep up on your ongoing sections (community service and leadership and other activities) by filling them out as you complete the task.
