- Fundraising:
 - Spring Bazaar – Cindy Hewlett reported – 40 tables; seemed to be enjoyed; decent turn out despite many other things happening in community; vendors posted on their FB feeds giving extra advertisement; had a family willing to do last minute concessions which vendors appreciated; *Had a 'raffle' – vendors donated a 'small item' to be awarded every half hour or so – well received; Cindi suggested possibility of doing fall bazaar Nov 26 as additional fundraiser – she is willing to chair; Janet R spoke as vendor – loves idea of fall bazaar and thinks would have a larger turnout for vendors and buyers; suggestion for concession – have kids run orders/foods as vendors can't leave their table

 - Herds –Mary Louise reported - June – if clubs want certain time let ML know or will be assigned 2-3 options; need a little touch up paint. More info forthcoming

 - Summer kick off June 3 – kids out of school at 11:30; 12-3pm - pizza and fun; must RSVP so we can order pizza: can use soccer fields -\$40 to rent - Janet moved; Rhianna 2nd; no discussion; motion passed; ML will send check and will set up a sign up genius;

 - July 1 – Drive in movie night at the fairgrounds – have concession stands etc. - send to clubs to volunteer

**Please select a cotton, cotton blend, or flannel fabric without plaids or stripes. Please no fleece.

- **Please prewash and iron your fabric before you come to sewing!
- Also bring your sewing basket with pins, scissors and a seam ripper.
- **Remember to practice sewing a seam and threading your machine before you come to the class if you have a sewing machine at home.

Intermediate and advanced sewers will work on projects they have selected.

Rabbit IDs

Rabbit IDs are **due June 1 to the extension office**. You must list all rabbits that you own to have the opportunity to bring your rabbit to fair.



LVRBA(Laramie Valley Rabbit Breeders Association) is hosting an ARBA sanctioned Double Open, Double Youth, Holland Lop Open & Youth Specialty Show, and Mini Rex Specialty Show on June 18, 2022 at Archer in Cheyenne. This would be a great show to go watch. For more information, contact Freda.

Albany County Fair Requirements:

All rabbits shown in breeding classes at Albany County Fair must have a permanent tattoo in their left ear and be vaccinated for RHDV2. NO EXCEPTIONS!!! Rabbits for breeding classes must be owned by June 1, 2022. Does producing a meat pen must be owned by April 15, 2022.

Rabbit Meat Pen and Single Fryer for 2022:

Rabbits must be 70 days or less in age as of show day. The rabbits must weigh between 3 1/2 and 5 1/2 pounds in weight on show day. You are limited to two entries per exhibitor. Each exhibitor will be allowed to sell one meat pen or single fryer at the Albany County Livestock Sale if the judge deems the pen "marketable". The limit of two animals of different species per consignor is still in effect. This is a terminal show. A market exhibitor may choose to not vaccinate. The buyer or seller who chooses not to vaccinate for RHDV2 shall sign a waiver recognizing the danger of taking an unvaccinated rabbit home and quarantine the rabbit for 30 days. if it is decided to not take the rabbit home they will become terminal at the discretion of fair management.

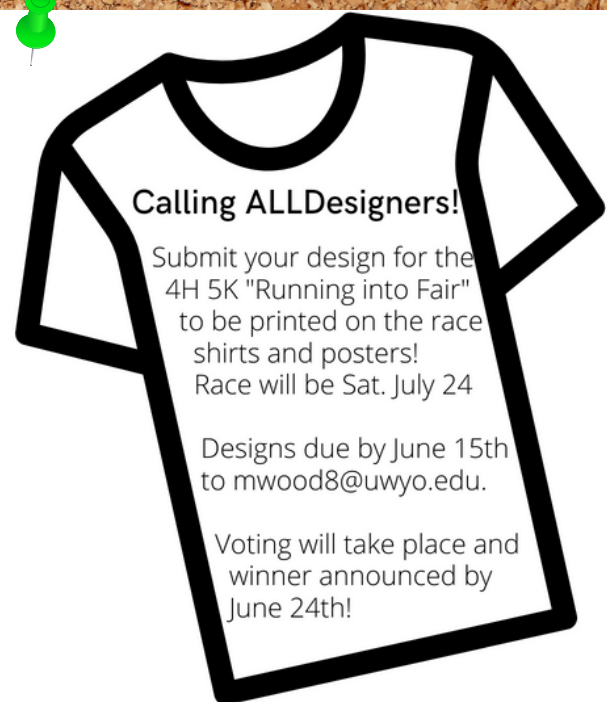

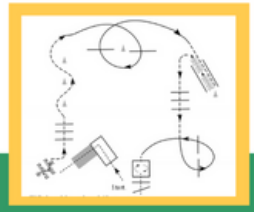

Livestock Scale Available for Checkout

A club may check the extension scale out overnight for \$10 per use. The scale will be checked for operability when it is brought back to the office. It is expected the scale will be transported to one location and all the club members will bring their animals to that location. If this does not work for individuals, arrangements can be made to bring your animal to the fairgrounds.



Calculating Market Weight

Use the following formula to determine how much weight your market animal should be gaining in order to meet the weight requirements for county fair:

- Determine the number of days until weigh-ins on Monday, August 1st
- Determine the average daily gain
 - Sheep: 0.5 - 0.75 pounds per day
 - Swine: 1.5 - 2.0 pounds per day
 - Beef: 2.5 - 2.8 pounds per day
 - Goat: .2 - .3 pounds per day
- Determine the target finishing weight (what you want your animal to weigh at county fair)
 - Sheep: min. weight for co. fair = 100#, no max
 - Swine: min weight for co. fair = 220#, max - 325#
 - Goat: min. weight for co fair = 50#, max. = 150#
 - Beef: min. weight of 1050#
- **Example:** You attend the June 1st weigh-in. You guess that your pig will gain approximately 1.7 pounds per day. There are 60 days until county fair weigh-ins on Aug. 1st. On that day you would like your pig to weigh 250 pounds. Now plug in those numbers to the formula to determine what your pig should weigh at the preliminary weigh-in:
 - (days to co. fair) x (avg. daily gain) = lbs. needed to gain → 60 days x 1.7 lbs. per day = 102 lbs to gain
 - (target finishing weight) - (lbs. to gain) = weight today → 250 lbs - 102 = 148 weight today

** Please note: In most circumstances, based on frame score and body condition, a typical market lamb, hog, steer or goat that weighs in at the *minimum* weight for county fair, may not be considered "market ready".

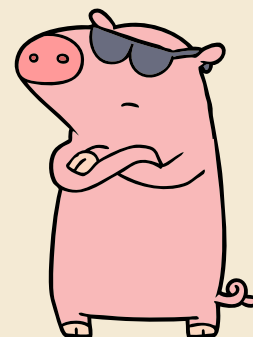




