

YN LIVESTOCK SPONSORING MARKET BEEF SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITY!!

YN Livestock would like to invite any Albany County 4H and FFA member who has never shown a market beef prior to 2022/2023 to apply for the YN Livestock Market Beef Scholarship. YN Livestock will provide (1) steer calf, show equipment including, but not limited to trimming chute, show box, tack, hay and grain for the duration of the project up to the Albany County fair, 2022. At the end of the project, equipment is returned to YN Livestock, member sells calf at the Albany County Livestock auction and keeps the sale proceeds. The intent is to offer an opportunity that would otherwise be improbable and to allow the member to set up a fund to assist them in pursuing future 4H or FFA market beef projects.

Eligibility: 4-H or FFA membership in Albany County, Wyoming. Has never shown a market beef prior to 2022/2023.

<u>Requirements</u>: Member must be able to provide adequate shelter, water and corral/pen for calf entire duration of project. Fill out application and questionnaire. Deadline is October 31, 2022

*Member must have support either from family or club to be able to do chores twice a day. Only one applicant will be selected.



A Note from Mary Louise



It is October, the start of a new 4-H year, a time to start setting goals and making plans for the next 4-H year. This translates into starting your record book...

- When you say the 4-H pledge you pledge (A solemn binding promise to do, give, or refrain from doing something) your head to clearer thinking. One great way to do that is to put on paper and write down your goals and your plan(s) to meet them. Studies show that true leaders have goals and have steps defined how to meet those goals.
- Record Keeping is a life skill. An employee needs to record the number of hours they work, an employer needs to keep track of expenses and profits, a US citizen needs to file a tax return. All these tasks require record keeping. Record books are a great resource to help with learning how to set goals, and track progress and document what has occurred.
