Project Meeting Fun-March 26, 2018





HORSE ID'S ARE NEW THIS SPRING!

Horse is the only animal which does not require us to "tag" them for county fair. This document will be our fair "tagging" process. How it works is simple. Fill out the information it asks for below. Then you will email, text though the remind system, or deliver the completed form to the Extension Office by May 1". Your paper will then get a project year sticker that will serve as our "tag". Next year if you are riding the same horse all you have to do is call and we will re-"tag" your paper. I encourage you to do this document for every horse you own, because if your horse is not ID'd and safety certified come county fair time you will not be able to ride that horse!

ATTENTION - All 4-H and FFA members who will be showing a market animal at the Campbell County Fair and are intending to sell that animal at the Youth Livestock Sale!!! **There will be a 15% commission charged on all animals selling at the Youth Livestock Sale. However, a youth can have their commission reduced to 5% by completing the following items:**

- 1. Attend one of the Youth Livestock Sale Mandatory Informational Meetings.
- 2. Fill out a W-9 for tax purposes at the Mandatory Meeting Please bring your social security number with you to the meeting.
- 3. Personally, deliver the two invitations for the Sale & Fair to the businesses that will be assigned to you at the Informational Meeting.
- 4. From the two businesses, obtain either a business card or updated information, such as new address, new contact person, out of business, or no longer wishes to be contacted.
- ** Have this information returned to the Fair Office by the County Fair Entry Deadline **
- 5. Must attend the mandatory set-up meeting the day of sale and help clean and set-up for the sale.
- 6. Deliver the thank-you plaque after the sale to your buyer and mail in postcard to the Fair Office before November 1st.

It is highly recommended that all youth, but especially First & Second year livestock members (regardless of age), attend with a parent or guardian.

PRESIDENT: Linda called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

AMERICAN PLEDGE: Led by Garrett

4-H PLEDGE: Led by Mariah

<u>SECRETARY'S REPORT:</u> The minutes were approved as printed in the newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORTS: Celeste reported that the council has a balance of \$23,033.58. The shooting sports has paid back all the funds borrowed for the purchase of the guns for the raffle. A deposit of \$2000.00 has been made for 4-H Camp. We have received the Campbell County Parks & Recreation Department grant for 4-H and Summer Day Camp 2018. There was \$1600.00 transferred from the Mel Lynch CD for 2017-2018 & 2018-2019 scholarships. Scholarships for spring have been paid for Courtney Fuller and Mary Woodworth. All other scholarship winners need to submit their spring schedules for payment of their scholarships. The Wyoming State 4-H Endowment made \$797.65 in 2017 and \$580.66 in the 1st quarter of 2018. Mariah moved to approve the treasurer's report, Garrett second it, and motion passes.

SPECIAL REQUESTS: Mariah with Green Clovers reported that they made \$984.80 at their bake sale. Garrett with 21 Divide requested that they be allowed to do concessions at the Hunter Safety Classes in March in Wright. Funds will be used towards camp fees for members that help. Garrett also requested that 21 Divide be allowed to have a cornhole tournament in March and funds will be used to help maybe put on a kid fishing derby during Wright Days, Cody moved to approve the fundraisers, Mariah second it, and motion passes. Eilish with Cross-Roads requested that they be allowed to have a booth at the Gillette Wild Hockey Games March 16th-18th to win a goodie basket, and they will also be selling 50/50 raffle tickets during this same time. Their club would also like permission to sell raffle tickets from now until the event for a Turkey Hunt in April. Funds from these fundraisers will be used for camp, club expenses(shirts), Awards at fair and maybe state fair. Cody moved to approve these fundraisers for CrossRoads, Garrett second it, and motion passes. Lane requested help from the council to go to National 4-H Conference in Washington, DC in April. He needs help with expenses such as his flight. He is hoping to get some good leadership experience to bring back to enhance the future 4-H member. As per our budget, Jody moved to give Lane \$200.00 for help with expenses, Duane second it, and motion passes.
