





TREASURER'S REPORT: Carrie reported that the council has \$20,566.43 in the checking account.

Hayden moved to approve the treasurers report, Will second it, and motion passes.

<u>VICE-PRESIDENT:</u> Chili Bingo was a success and turned out well despite the cold weather that day. There was about 85-90 people in attendance and the council made \$740.89.

SPECIAL REQUESTS: Wool Judging reported on some fundraisers. They made \$455.00 on their quilt

raffle, \$515.00 on popcorn sales, & \$414.95 on gift wrapping and craft fair. They also requested assistance to help pay for the state contest on April 9th & 10th. Ben moved to approve the council paying for hotel and registration fees for the members competing and their coach per the set budget guidelines, Will second it, and motion passes. Blue Ribbon made \$77.25 at the concessions at the Fun Shoot and have extra inventory left over for the next time. They also requested that they be allowed to do concessions on June 13th for county shoot. Funds will be used for club activities. Lee moved to approve the fundraiser, Meghan second it, and motion passes. Clover Express had 3 requests; they first requested that they be allowed to do lunches at the Hunter Safety Classes on March 13th & 14th for \$5/plate. Funds will be used to thank the instructors for their time. Their second request is to do concessions at the Jackpot Shoot on April 10th in Wright. Funds will be used for camp fees & club scholarship. Their third request is to sell candy bars from April to May. Funds will be used for camp fees & club scholarship. Sam moved to approve all three fundraisers, Katie second it, and motion passes. Wild Horse requested that they be allowed to do a raffle and sell baked goods & crafts at Bomgaars on April 24th & May 10th. Funds will be used for community service projects, camp fees, and club activities. Hayden moved to approve this fundraiser, Kristi second it, and motion passes. Shannon with the Master Gardeners asked if the council would be interested in donating a wagon to be used at the 4th of July parade. Deana moved to approve that the council move forward with donating one, Amanda second it, and motion passes. Deana then amended the motion to use up to \$250.00 towards the wagon and everything else that we may need to decorate it, Aly second it, and motion passes. We will have a committee to work on it moving forward.

KIM & CELESTE: Kim would like to know if the leader appreciation line in the budget can be used towards small tokens of appreciation for leaders and the council is all in agreement that would be fine. The Livestock Committee is working on classes and events for the spring. Young Leaders are going to be doing activities with clubs in March and April. The Clover Buds has three meeting left. The new intern is Emily Acord for the spring. The Children's Festival is not set-in stone but the date in mind is May 15th. Cake Decorating classes are starting this week. Project Week is March 15th-19th and Mondays classes are flipped between the morning and afternoon. Summer Day Camp is full with a waiting list already. Sewing Conference is set for May, check the newsletter for dates and more information on it. Beginning sewing classes are starting during Spring Break week with classes continuing once a month. Shooting Sports are continuing practices with the Jackpot Shoot on April 10th and registration is coming up in April. The mandatory livestock meetings are in May. The last Robotics class is this week for this session, there may be more coming.

ATTENTION - All 4-H and FFA members who will be showing a market animal at the Campbell County Fair and are intending to sell that animal at the Youth Livestock Sale must attend!!! **There will be a 15% commission charged on all animals selling at the Youth Livestock Sale. However, a youth can have their commission reduced to 5% by completing the following items:**

- 1. Attend one of the Youth Livestock Sale Mandatory Informational Meetings.
- 2. Fill out a W-9 for tax purposes at the Mandatory Meeting Please bring your **social security number** with you to the meeting.
- 3. Personally, deliver the two invitations for the Sale & Fair to the businesses that will be assigned to you at the Informational Meeting.
- 4. From the two businesses, obtain updated information, such as new address, new contact person, out of business, or no longer wishes to be contacted.
- ** Have this information returned to the Fair Office by the County Fair Entry Deadline **
- 5. <u>Must</u> attend the mandatory set-up meeting the day of sale and help clean and set-up for the sale.
- 6. Deliver the thank-you plaque after the sale to your buyer and mail in postcard to the Fair Office before October 1st.

It is highly recommended that all youth, but especially First & Second year livestock members (regardless of age), attend with a parent or guardian.
