In November, I had the privilege of presenting at the National 4-H Educators meeting with other fellow Wyoming Educators. Our topic of discussion was *Aligning Recognition to Meet Volunteer Preferences*. We chose this as a topic because it is something we all need to be aware of, to continually appreciate others based on what they would prefer. A key part of this presentation was the 5 Languages of Appreciation based by multiple books written by Gary Chapman.

The 5 Languages of Appreciation are as follows:

Words of Affirmation- uses words to affirm people Thank you notes, positive comments, publicly recognizing

Acts of Service- actions speak louder than words
Assisting in cleaning up, completing a task, asking "How can I help?"

Receiving Gifts- people like things to feel appreciated Technology, gift cards, coffee

Quality Time- giving someone undivided attention Efficient meetings, face to face time, making time to help

Physical Touch- making appropriate touches Hug, pat on the back, high five or special handshake


Ingredients

- 1 cup unsalted butter (2 sticks)
- 4 ounces cream cheese (half a brick)
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg yolk, large
- · 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 tablespoon <u>red food coloring</u> (liquid)
- 3 cups <u>all-purpose flour</u>
- 1/4 cup <u>cornstarch</u>
- · 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt


Instructions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F and line baking sheets with parchment paper.
- Place the butter, cream cheese, and sugar in a large mixing bowl and beat on medium-low speed until smooth (about 1 minute).
- Add the egg yolk, vanilla, and food coloring and mix on medium speed until combined.
- Scrape the bottom and sides of the bowl with a silicone spatula, then add the flour, cocoa, cornstarch, and salt.
- 5. Mix on medium-low speed until a stiff dough forms (about 30 seconds to 1 minute).
- Roll the dough to 3/16-inch thick (<u>rolling pin rings</u> ensure an even and exact thickness) between 2 sheets of parchment paper.
- Remove the top sheet of parchment, and cut shapes with a 3-inch heart cookie cutter.
- 8. Peel the shapes from the bottom layer of parchment, and transfer to the prepared baking sheets.
- 9. Bake for 12 to 16 minutes, or until set around the edges but still a little soft towards the center.
- Cool completely, then frost with <u>royal icing</u>.
