





In this very sensitive and challenging time, the Fair Board and Youth Livestock Sale would like to reach out to the 4-H/FFA members and their families. We are hoping you are all finding a way to take care of yourselves and each other. We are supporting and following Campbell County's health recommendations and guidelines concerning COVID-19. Complying with the current health concerns and due to the unknown time frame for planning the Mandatory Meetings scheduled in May, adjustments have been implemented this year to continue the YLS project paperwork on-line or by mail. Continue to monitor the Campbell County Fair Website and we will notify you with any updates and/or changes.

On April 27th, transitioning virtually, a YLS Packet will be available on-line, e-mail, mail, or curbside pickup. The "Information Form" and "W-9" are <u>due</u> to the <u>Fair Office</u> on MAY 15th by 5:00pm *No Exceptions*. Please read and follow the current updated requirements to qualify a 4-H/FFA project for the Youth Livestock Sale. Contact any of the following for a YLS Packet:

This year the YLS will be contacting businesses as potential buyers for the sale. Currently due to the limited access and time frame, it isn't possible for youth to be able visit businesses and send back their signed business cards.

Sheep, Goat, and Swine tags will be requested on the YLS "Information Form" for each family. Please fill in the requested quantity of tags needed per species per FAMILY. After receiving the finalized documents at the Fair Office, the tags will be mailed or available curbside pick-up.

The Fair book will be available on the Campbell County Fair Website on April 13th or curbside pick-up the first week of May. It is very important that Youth members with their parent/guardian read and understand the Youth Livestock Sale and Youth Livestock Shows General Policies. This would be a great homework assignment in our current situation.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Thank you's were read.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Carrie reported that the council has \$12,362.79 in checking. There will be approximately \$15,000 transferred back to the council from the Shooting Sports line for the loan to purchase guns for the raffle in March.

<u>SPECIAL REQUESTS:</u> Blue Ribbon made \$166.75 on concessions at the Fun Shoot. City Ranchers made \$1179.00 after expenses on the sale of doughnuts. Funds will be used towards 4-H Camp.

Sharon bought supplies for the trailer while going to get the doughnuts. We will reimburse her for these supplies.

KIM & CELESTE: The Livestock Committee made \$638.00 on their fundraiser at Applebees and roughly \$205.00 on T-shirt sales. They had their Mini Level Up camp last month, and it all went great. They are looking at doing an event in June & July. They have ideas on what to do for the 4 main species as well. Horsemanship is over for HDC and not a lot going on until the Summer. We have new record books for this year. The will be a class on March 10th about them and it will be recorded. This month's topic for Cloverbuds is Shooting Sports; there will be games and Rick Johnson will be coming in. The Fair Board voted to have rabbit id's and tags have been sent out. The Wyoming Counselor Camp is set for the end of the month in Douglas. Summer Day Camp registration is going on right now and almost full. Project Week is still set for the week of March 16th-20th, spring break week. There is an opportunity to go to a fashion show at the University of Wyoming in May, information in the newsletter. There is a chance to get involved in Fabric and Fashion with beginning sewing classes with Dane Joslyn who is also our new superintendent at Fair. Sewing conference will be in June, registration is now open and due May 18th. Mandatory livestock meetings are in May, check the newsletter for dates and times. The Jackpot Shoot is April 18th in Wright at 9 am.


Build a Boat

Need: Tinfoil and change Give your cloverbud a sheet of tinfoil.

- 2. Tell them they have to make a boat out of that tin foil that has to hold 10 coins.
- Give them 5 minutes to build their boat.test their boat in a deep sink or bathtub.
- If you have siblings around you can make it a contest for which boat can hold the most coins



Instructions: Mix together flour and sand. Mix in baby oil really well. Enjoy!



Egg Drop Challenge

Need: Really, anything found around the house will work, let your cloverbud use their thinking skills to come up with their own ideas. If they are really struggling a good start could be; cotton balls, string, old clothing, empty jars/tubs, tape, playdough, etc.

Give your cloverbud supplies to create some kind of safety so that the egg will not break when

dropped. To save a mess you can

hard boil the egg first.



How many Drops fill the Dot

Need: Paper, pen, water, food dye and a dropper

- Draw many sized circles on the peice of paper
- Have your cloverbud use the dropper to drop as many drops of water into the circle as it takes to fill it.
- Talk about why the bigger dots take more drops of water (volume increases with diameter- width of circle)

Washable Stainglass

Need: washable crayola paint, water and masking tape

- Help your cloverbud tape the window in different shapes (triangles, trapazoids, etc.)
 Water down the crayola washable paint.
- Let your cloverbud paint away
 It will wash of with Dawn Soap
 and water
