Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting Cottonwood Room, GAMB, Gillette, WY

April 5, 2021

The April Steering Committee Meeting was called to order by Vice-President Diane Monahan at 5:17pm. A quorum was established.

Attending the meeting was Rick Kistler, Shannon Hudson, Heather Kleiner, Linette West, Diane Monahan, Sandi Aberle, Sandra Hunter, Tracey Archer, and Mandy Reynolds, Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator.

The agenda was reviewed:

Treasurer's Report was given by Heather Kleiner. She stated we had income from the Hoop House sale, the Home Show, and Tree sales.

There will not be any committee reports during the meeting, however the Tree Sale Committee, Urban Orchard/Pollinator Committee and Education Committee will be meeting after the regular meeting.

Mandy stated that at the March meeting we had discussed looking into the Arbor Day Grants, but learned they are due in December, so we can look at this again later in the year, for next year.

Hub insurance sent a bill for \$84, but there is an uncertainty of why, so these papers were handed to Sandi Aberle to have them reach out to Hub.

Tracey has a paper that needs to be signed for the bank, both to get officers on the account, and to get others off. This sheet was passed around to the officers there for the Steering Committee Meeting.

Linette will be giving an update regarding the Home Show. She stated she will be thanking those that assisted. There were some vard call requests as well as two garden walk "wannabees."

Awards Night Awards need to be picked picked up from Tracey, who has them with her.

The WSF Grant has been approved. The Urban Orchard/Gazebo Pollinator Project has already allocated the amounts. Heather Kleiner's husband has been "voluntold" for building the pergola. Menards has one in its sale page. A question has also been raised about electric being in the vicinity in order for lights to be able to be strung on the pergola for weddings. Diana will look into this. Our last Urban Orchard work day was cancelled, so we are looking to have the next one on April 14th, from 4 to 7. A sign up sheet will be passed around during the meeting. Out at the Gazebo, there are existing bulbs that have started popping up, as well as woodbine. Everyone is encouraged to come and get what they want! The question was asked of when we should order plants to work out on the Gazebo. We can order now for Fall bulbs, and Heather was given a list of the desired plants to check for them at Landon's

The cards we are going to pass out at the 4th of July Parade could also have something about bees on them.

Old Business:

Officers that will be on the bank account will receive an email to go to First Interstate Bank, after all the paperwork is turned in. A letter was sent around for present officers as well as the officers from last year, were to sign.

Linette reported that the Home Show went well. There were not as many people this year, however Saturday there was a good number of people and Sunday there was a reasonable number. She thanks everyone that helped and donated.

Tracey handed out the rewards from last year to the members that were present at the meeting and had not received them yet.

New Business:

The WSF Grant has been approved. The Urban Orchard/Gazebo Pollinator Project Committee has allocated the amounts from this grant. The bench has already been purchased and positioned. Sheets were handed out explaining how all the funds are broken down. Heather is going to check into the plants desired for the project. Heather's husband has been "voluntold" for the building of the pergola. The work date for working on the Orchard and Gazebo Planter is April 14th at the Urban Orchard, from 4 -7 PM. If you can attend, your help would be greatly appreciated.

There are existing bulbs, woodbine, etc growing out by the Gazebo. In order to do the desired construction and planting, these are free for the taking. Just come out and get them.

Due to Covid restrictions, those that are attending the GLEE event at the Library, are asked to RSVP. Master Gardener volunteers will be presenting on four topics. It was supposed to be five, however Sharon Murphree is so longer able to attend. Sandra and Heather were going to work together to fill in that time, however Jodi Kruse has now also offered to teach the seed tape making. Lunch will be provided so that Dr. Ball can mingle with those attending, and then he will be speaking for an hour afterwards, and then having Q&A. This will be published on Facebook again, advertising the class. Tree Diagnostics had 38 people, so we are expecting a decent crowd. At the library, we should set up a table with pictures advertising the Community Garden, to get word out.

Please try to find anyone interested in donating a planted wagon. Patsy suggested having a Master Gardener at each block, to hand out cards and seeds along that block, rather than everyone walking the entire thing. There will be a sign-up sheet once we get closer to time. We still do not know the theme yet. For the Garden walk, we have five houses right now. We need to save white Walmart bags. We will have the whole block. For advertising and such, we are looking to possibly putting banners on the barricades, but what else can we set up? An information booth was suggested, as was possibly getting the 4-H children or Cloverbuds involved.
