Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting

June 7, 2021 Diana Ohman's home – Gillette, WY

The June Steering Committee Meeting was called to order at 5:27pm by Vice-President Diane Monahan. A quorum was established.

Attending the meeting were Mandy Reynolds (Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator), Linette West, Sandi Aberle, Shannon Hudson, Heather Kleiner, Ruth Lundborg, Diane Monahan, and Diana Ohman.

The agenda was reviewed:

Treasurer's report was given by Heather Kleiner, including comparisons of past three years and this year's income, expenses, and loss/profit for the tree sale. Final numbers for the gazebo and urban pochard projects were given as well. We overspent by \$23.34.

Should we have Wendy Clements look into getting signs made for the gazebo planters? Should we possibly leave it be for a couple months and revisit the possibility? Perhaps we could have a sign made stating "Designed by Master Gardeners and maintained by..." Diane is going to explore some options.

Any officers who have not signed the needed paperwork for the bank account needs to do so.

Trees have been checked on. They are being watered and they look really good. There are less than the 108 cottonwoods as stated in the newsletter.

The W-9 for the Urban Orchard and Gazebo Planter were sent in today, so we should get a check. Thank you, Sandra Hunter and Heather Kleiner, for all their help with the plants, as well as the Hudson children for mulching the trees.

The Wyoming State Forestry was supposed to get 100 trees, however we only received 75. Tara, with WSF, was told the 25 Ponderosa Pines did not arrive. The 25 Lodgepole Pines went to Wright. The 25 Honey Locusts and the 25 Bur Oaks went to the City of Gillette.

In May, Sandi Aberle taught a class on Pruning Fruit Trees and Grape Vines. During the meeting, she will comment on this.

The next pollinator count will be Wednesday, 9 June 2021, at 1215.

Multiple Master Gardeners have asked about shirts with the logo on them. Do we want to have something embroidered? We do not have funds allotted for this, so perhaps a better option would be to have those interested take the item in themselves to get embroidered. It was asked if we have permission to use the logo? Mandy requested a Campbell County logo from the University. Perhaps that could be emailed to the Embroidery Place, and then each individual could take in whatever they want the logo on, have it made, and pay for it individually.

Janet gave Mandy handouts for open class entries for the County Fair.

Mandy brought Thank You cards for us to sign for 1st National Bank for the Tree sale, the Wyoming State Forestry, and the Ice Arena Employees.

Mandy will be out of town from June 18th through the 27th. She has a funeral on the 28th, so she will not actually be in the office again until the 29th. She has brought a sign-up sheet for yard calls, while she is gone. Please put both your name as well as your strengths, if you would like to field any yard calls. The list will be given to Tracey, who will contact those listed if any calls come in while Mandy is out.

There are seed packets available for the "Grow Extra Campaign." The weight of the produce donated can count towards hours.

We need to decide how we are going to handle the meeting for July. It is scheduled for the 5th. Do we want to have one then, still?

Linette will discuss the Garden Walk during the regular meeting. The pamphlet needs to be "spiffier" up. Perhaps we could add pictures from the gardens we will be visiting.

Meeting was called to order by Vice-President Diane Monahan at 6:23. A quorum was established.

Introductions were made. A huge thank you to Diana Ohman for opening her home up for the June meetings, and for the delicious dinner!

Diana is in the garden walk for this year. She may need some advice and help J Our meeting in July will be held at Sandi Aberle's home and the August meeting will be at Jody's mother-in-law's home.

Sandi Aberle moved to approve the May minutes as published. Heather Kleiner seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Heather Kleiner gave the Treasurer's report. She also went over the income, expenses for the trees, and the profit/deficits for the tree sales for 2018 through the present.

Mandy reported on the Gazebo and Urban Orchard project. The W-9 was sent today. We should get the check for \$5K soon. We overspent by \$23.34. There has already been a wedding at the gazebo! Pictures of before and after, which were sent in with the grant, were passed around.

Linette spoke about the Garden Walk. We were encouraged to sign up for manning a house. On July 1st we will be meeting at 2pm to work on the float for the 4th of July parade. We will have a picnic afterwards. The theme for the parade is Red, White and Boom. We are going with "bloom" rather than "boom."

The parade is on the 4th. It will start at noon, so we will need to be in line by 11. Volunteers will walk just a block or two each, and hand out advertisement cards for the garden walk. Hopefully we will have all the planted wagons by the first! After the parade, the wagons will be taken downtown, to display them. As of right now, we should have around twenty wagons.

On July 8th, we will meet at 3 PM at the Extension Office, to tour the homes that will be part of the Garden Walk.

Mandy brought Thank You cards for us to sign for 1st National Bank for the Tree sale, the Wyoming State Forestry, and the Ice Arena Employees. She gave fruit trays as a thank you to Rayne Gardens, Tractor Supply, and Bomgaars for giving us seeds.

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The First Lady of Wyoming is working with the Hunger Awareness Initiative. There are seed packets available for the "Grow Extra Campaign." The weight of the produce donated can count towards hours. Produce can be do-

nated to the Council of Community Services or the Extension Office.
