Heather Kleiner was not in attendance to give Treasurer's Report. Mandy stated the check for the grant had been received, and the Wedding Garden, aka Gazebo, looks great.

Linette spoke regarding the Garden walk. First, however, she thanked the fabulous volunteers that helped with the parade, including those that walked and pulled wagons, those who decorated, and the extension office who printed out the tickets for the Garden Walk.

-Tomorrow morning (Tuesday – July 6<sup>th</sup>), the wagons will be moved from the Community Garden, to be displayed downtown, where they will stay until Saturday. Around 1030 the wagons will be watered each day. Those who are able to help with this, please meet at the Hallmark area at 1030 each day. Linette will be putting the sponsors' names on the wagons tomorrow as she puts them out.

-On Thursday afternoon, at 3:00pm, we will be meeting at the extension office to go take a tour of the gardens on the Garden Walk and get our assignments for which house we will be at, as well as getting our signage. On Saturday morning we are to put the signs up in front of the house we are assigned to. After the Garden walk, take your signage out and be sure to return it. There are eight houses total. In order to keep things moving along that evening, we will set a timer... 20 minutes at each home, and ten minutes to travel.

-The businesses will need to leave the wagon out overnight on Friday night. At 7:30am on Saturday, the Master Gardeners will walk the wagons from the businesses down to Third Street Plaza. Sandi will pick up Plant Shack and Rayne Garden's on Friday. First Interstate may be keeping theirs, so we need to check with them to see if we need to move it Saturday.

-At Third Street Plaza, people can come and purchase raffle tickets for the wagons. The winners will be drawn around 4:30pm. Also in the area, the Young Leaders will be doing some face painting. We will also have cookies there. Anyone who wants to donate cookies, please have two to three cookies per bag, and deliver them Saturday morning. First National has offered to supply waters and Mandy will be supplying lemonade. Next to each wagon will be a coffee can, and individuals can put their raffle ticket in the coffee can that goes with the wagon(s) they are hoping to win.

-The plan is that Heather Kleiner will be going Friday afternoon to pick up remaining tickets and money from tickets already sold, from the businesses. After some discussion it was decided to leave the tickets at the businesses to let them continue selling them. Mandy will be printing more tickets.

-Mandy brought postcards with her. We could possibly hand them out at the RV Rally. Sandra Hunter is willing to go right after this meeting.

-So that those purchasing tickets know what they want to put their raffle tickets in for, a picture of each wagon will be taken, with a number on each wagon. This poster will be at each of the businesses, as well as at each house. At each house will be an envelope that you can put the tickets in. They can leave their tickets with you, as long as it has their name, phone number, and what wagon they want their raffle ticket to go to. This also means the houses need change for tickets... probably \$20 worth of \$1 bills.

# If you need assistance logging your hours, let me know! I am here to help you!

To earn the Master Gardener Volunteer certificate requires 40 hours of volunteer service. The timeline to get those 40 hours is very flexible, but generally 1-2 years is acceptable. There is no requirement for continuing education prior to completing the 40 volunteer hours. Following the completion of 40 volunteer hours there is a requirement of 10 continuing education hours and 20 volunteer hours per year to remain an Active Master Gardener.

# Here is a quick way to report your volunteer hours! Using your smartphone, follow the directions below.



1. Open the camera app on your smartphone.

2. Focus the camera on the QR code, you might have to gently tap the code. You also might have move your phone around until it "picks up" the QR code.

3. Follow the instructions on the screen to complete the action. It might ask if you want to open "uwyoextension.org" in Safari.

4. Tap on that link and you are to the reporting link.
