Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting

4 October 2021 Cottonwood, GAMB – Gillette WY

The October Steering Committee Meeting was called to order at 5:15pm by Mandy Reynolds, Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator. A quorum was established.

Attending the meeting were Mandy Reynolds (Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator), Deb Reno Sams, Shannon Hudson, Rich Kistler, Heather Kleiner, and Sandra Hunter.

The agenda was reviewed:

Changes need to be made to the bylaws again in order for them to align with how we are doing things and with the state guidelines.

Old Business:

Vicki Hayman held a Canning Your Garden Harvest class at the library on August 12th. 21 people attended. Ryan Boyd, Sandra Hunter, Sandi Aberle, and Mandy Reynolds held a Putting Your Garden to Bed class on September 23rd. 17 people attended this class.

New Business:

When we compare Wyoming Master Gardener Bylaws and Campbell County Master Gardener Bylaws, several changes need to be made. Patsy Larson is taking a look at some of these materials.

Several committees need to begin meeting. The Nominating Committee does not have any members, though nominations were supposed to be tonight, with elections supposed to be happening at our November meeting. Committee duties and officer duties were typed up for nominations tonight, if that happens. These duties need to line up with the bylaws. We also need to discuss what happens if someone resigns or moves during their term.

The Tree Sale Committee needs to meet so we can start looking at ordering trees. Sandi Aberle gave Mandy an order form for a different nursery that may be of interest. Meeting dates need to be made and trees need to be decided upon and ordered. Heather may know of a nursery we may want to look at as well. Our Committee Chair needs to step in beforehand, especially for ordering trees for the tree sale. Last year Nan ordered for the Master Gardener preorders, but for the Tree Sale Day, Mandy ordered. Teresa will be taking over Nan's part, and possibly do it through the extension office.

The Awards Banquet Committee also needs to meet. We have discussed moving the date of this, as not all hours are in, in November. With Covid numbers going up again right now, this may be the year to move it to January. January may also be a slower time of year for people, as it is after the holidays.

There will be a Planting a Bonsai class on October 21st, in the Cottonwood Room, at 6 PM. A signup sheet will be available during the regular meeting.

There will be a Painting Activity with Linette on November 18th, in the Cottonwood Room, at 6 PM. This will need to be confirmed with Linette.

Horticulture Program Coordinator's Announcements:

Campbell County Master Gardeners Regular Meeting

4 October 2021 Cottonwood, GAMB – Gillette WY

Meeting was called to order by President Deb Reno-Sams at 6:02pm. A quorum was established.

Attending were Suzy Blakesley, Bill Brown, Fawn Conrad, Jared Green, Shannon Hudson, Sandra Hunter, Rich Kistler, Heather Kleiner, Jody Kruse, Heather Moots (via Zoom), Teresa Norton, Deb Reno-Sams, Mary Schoen (via Zoom), Janet Thompson, Linette West (via Zoom), and Mandy Reynolds, Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator. Introductions were made.

Jody Kruse moved to approve the July and August minutes as published. Rich Kistler seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Heather Kleiner gave the Treasurer's Report. A payment was made to Rayne Gardens for the Bonsai supplies. A check had also been written to the 4H Council. They had accidently paid for the plates on our trailer, so this is to reimburse them.

Vicki Hayman held a Canning Your Garden Harvest class at the library on August 12th. 21 people attended. Ryan Boyd, Sandra Hunter, Sandi Aberle, and Mandy Reynolds held a Putting Your Garden to Bed class on September 23rd. 17 people attended this class. There were new people at both of these classes!

The State Bylaws need to match the County Bylaws and right now they do not align correctly. As such, we need to update our bylaws. One discrepancy is the mandatory hours to report. According to the state we need twenty volunteer hours and ten continuing education hours, however, our bylaws only state 15 and 8 respectfully. The state also talks about an annual recertification form. Do we want to do this? After discussion, we have decided against doing the recertification form. We also need to include office descriptions and well as committee chair and cochair descriptions written out. Mandy typed up a basic outline, but these need to align with the bylaws as well. The Chairman of the committees is also suppose to give information to Mandy to put in the newsletter. We need leadership and accountability. Rich, Heather, Shannon, and Patsy were on the bylaw committee in the past. They are willing to do it again, with exception of possibly Patsy, as she is not here tonight to agree or disagree. She will be contacted, and the group will meet with Mandy in the near future, before the next meeting to go over the bylaws again. The suggested changes will be brought before the group at the next meeting and then voted on at the following meeting.

Several committees need to begin meeting as soon as possible! Typically the nominating committee brings forth nominations. However, this year there is no one on the nominating committee. At this point, Diane Monahan has been nominated for President, Rich Kistler for Vice President, Shannon Hudson for Secretary, and possibly Fawn Conrad for Treasurer. Linette West will stay on the steering committee and other committees, but does not want any chairs.

The Tree Sale Committee needs to meet so we can start looking at ordering trees. Sandi Aberle gave Mandy an order form for a different nursery that may be of interest. Meeting dates need to be made and trees need to be decided upon and ordered. Heather may know of a nursery we may want to look at as well. Our Committee Chair needs to step in beforehand, especially for ordering trees for the tree sale. Last year Nan ordered for the Master Gardener preorders, but for the Tree Sale Day, Mandy ordered. Teresa will be taking over Nan's part, and possibly do it through the extension office. We need a chair that will take the leadership role. Fawn Conrad was nominated, however she respectfully declined. Fawn is willing to possibly co-chair though. Fawn suggested Sandi Aberle, however Sandi is out of state. Mandy will send out a survey to pick a date to meet together, and then we will go from there.

Garden walk Committee also needs to start planning, though it really becomes more focused in January. We should start looking for houses. Postcards are sent around Easter. Rich Kistler is the chair this year.

The Awards Banquet is usually held in November. This is because we do not have a meeting in December. However, not all hours are in by then. Should we change it to January? In January we could do the Years in Service awards, dinner, vote for the budget and be done. We could have the current year officers and the next year officers meet in December, decide on the budget, and present it in January. This would need to be added to the bylaws.

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We are planning a painting activity with Linette on November 18th at 6 PM in the Cottonwood Room. We will be painting a pumpkin.

On October 21st, we will be having a Planting a Bonsai class in the Cottonwood Room at 6 PM. We have a limit of 40 participants. There is a sign up sheet on the side table. We have bought five plants and containers that we will be shown how to plant.

We are back to reporting our Master Gardener hours like normal. The state says we need 20 hours of volunteer time and 10 continuing education hours. Our Bylaws only say 15 and 8, respectfully. Also, one pound of donated produce is equivalent to one hour of volunteer time.

There is a new booklet on specialty crops. It is divided by counties, and different producers are listed along with the items they sell. It does not seem to be all inclusive.

On September 23rd, there was a County Employees Wellness Fair. About 100 people came. Mandy took two seeds displays to it. We have received a large donation of seeds from Walmart. There are two additional cabinets down in the Extension Office now. The older seeds were moved into these and Tracey is working on organizing the new seeds in the blue cabinets. Due to the class in August, the one in September, and then the Wellness Fair, there has been a great number of people coming to ask about seeds! In the past we would use the much older seeds to rejuvenate plots at the community garden. We may want to look into making a cover crop mix.

There have been three main categories of calls coming in – insects, trees, and water. For insects, aphids have been big this year including black and white ones. There was also a concern that the killer wasps may have been here as well as lilac borers. The one tree call was regarding a tree that lightening had struck. It was split pretty badly. Roy sent Mandy a tree rating form that allows the owner to see why the recommendation being made is done so. In the case of this specific tree, it was recommended to cut it down, as it was not viable and was actually quite hazardous to leave up. With how dry we have been this year, a lack of watering has been a main issue this year!

The Extension Office will be closed on October 11th. Mandy will be out of the office for the remainder of the week.

If you donated produce, you have to enter .50 hours in as volunteer time. An example would be .50 hours volunteer time and 6 pounds of produce donated. Your pounds will be manually added in as volunteer hours.

If you need assistance logging your hours, let me know! I am here to help you!

To earn the Master Gardener Volunteer certificate requires 40 hours of volunteer service. The timeline to get those 40 hours is very flexible, but generally 1-2 years is acceptable. There is no requirement for continuing education prior to completing the 40 volunteer hours. Following the completion of 40 volunteer hours there is a requirement of 8 continuing education hours and 15 volunteer hours per year to remain an Active Master Gardener.

Remember that 1 pound of donated produce equals 1 volunteer hour!
