

The Clover Blast

Last November, Celeste and I attended the National Conference for 4-H Professionals. There were project-based, teen and Cloverbud, and interpersonal development classes. The best part is bringing back information to make Campbell County 4-H even better.

A wonderful course that I attended was on the 4-H Leadership Tree. In this class, we related developing youth leadership like planting a tree. There are different stages from seeds to roots and branches that grow before a tree fully develops, just like leadership. When working with youth, we need to help through the process: exploring, emerging, developing, advancing, and exemplary.

The first two stages are exploring and emerging. In these stages, youth are learners. We focus on the learning or what happens below the ground. Explore interests, become involved, take informal leadership roles like leading an activity or helping at an event.

Within developing and advancing, youth are leaders. Growth begins above the ground. Take on roles where youth work with others, a team, or group. In those roles, increasingly take responsibilities with less support and guidance. Let the youth take charge.

The final stage is youth as social change agents. This stage is where youth take their knowledge and leadership skills from the previous stages to act on issues they care about. 4-H allows youth to be a change agent through young leaders, community service, and project development. These youth are “bearing fruit” to nourish others, “providing shade” to protect others, and “planting seeds” that will inspire future leaders.

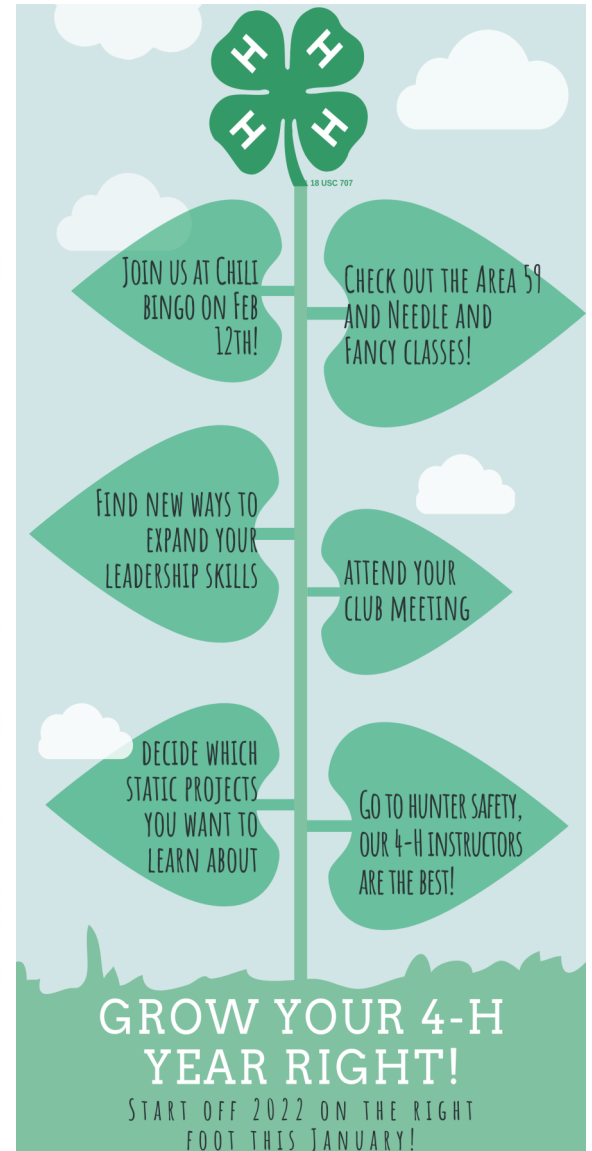

- **Chicken scratch** - Another name for chicken scratch embroidery is Amish embroidery, depression lace, or snowflake embroidery. This is mainly due to the design the stitching makes. They look like lace or snowflakes along the gingham fabric. This style of stitching is an inexpensive version of creating a lace look.
- **Regular Cross-stitch** is a form of sewing and a popular form of counted-thread embroidery in which X-shaped stitches in a tiled like pattern are used.

01/22/22 - Cross stitch - Blackwork Technique -

- Like counted cross-stitch, blackwork can be worked over one or two threads of fabric.

02/05/22, 02/19/22 & 03/05/22 - Hardanger Embroidery -

- Hardanger is a combination of a few types of stitches. Embroidery, satin stitch, drawn work, cut work, white work, needle weaving, etc. Believe it or not, Hardanger is not difficult to do.

STEP 3: Horse ID Sheet. If you ID'd your horse last year, please contact the office if you plan to use that horse again this year. 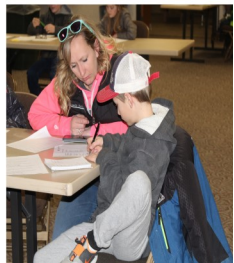

IMPORTANT BEEF TAGGING INFORMATION Market Beef and Supreme Cow (Phase I)

Wyoming State Fair (WSF) rules state that all market beef animals must be owned by February 1st. Campbell County Fair follows the WSF ownership and tagging deadline allowing market beef animals to be shown at County and State Fair. Per Campbell County Fair Rules, Supreme Cow, Phase I heifers must also be owned and tagged by February 1st.

For 2022, the following steps will be taken to tag beef for 4-H and FFA.

- Tags will only be handed out to exhibitors at the Campbell County Extension Office (Monday – Friday, 8am to 5pm), Gillette FFA, Coal Country FFA, Wright FFA, and Fair Office beginning now and ending February 1st. All tags given out must be accounted for or returned to the Fair Office.
- You will receive one tag per animal.
- You will be responsible for tagging your own animal. If you need assistance, please contact the 4-H Office, FFA Teacher, or Fair Office. The WSF is using RFID Electronic Tags to work with ShoWorks software. The tags have a chip in them that allows Fair personnel to scan the tag and put info into the system. **The last 5 numbers on the button tag MUST match the flag tag!!!**
 - Please put the tag in the **RIGHT** ear on Steers and the **LEFT** ear on Heifers (due to Bangs tattoo). 
 - The button portion of the tag should be on the outside/back of the ear with the EID tag application. 
 - Y-TEX Taggers are available for purchase at local feed stores. **It must be a Y-TEX Tagger.** If you have difficulty finding a tagger. 
 - Please contact the 4-H Office at 682-7281 or Fair Office at 687-0200 for a loaner. 
- Take 3 pictures of your animal.
 - One picture of the full, left side
 - One picture of the full, right side
 - One picture of the head with the ear tag in the ear
 - Each picture needs to be identified with the owner of the beef, side, and Tag Number. **Example:** J.Doe, Tag 290 152, right side view
- Supreme Cow must also have a bangs vaccination tag ID recorded on form. **Don't Forget!** 
- *Check this out*** If interested in participating in the *Market Beef Campbell County Born & Raised Contest*, please review the eligibility and regulations; found on the website, in the fair book (page 89), or contacting the 4H, FFA, & Fair Office. The Declaration must be received by **5pm, Monday, February 7th, 2022**. This is **NOT** your Fair entry!! It's required to enter the animal in the Market Class and Campbell County B&R with your fair entries starting in May.
- Send pictures and information for each tag to the Fair Office using one of the two options (a. & b.) below **ONLY**. **NO TEXTING OR FACEBOOK MESSAGES WILL BE ACCEPTED!!**
 - Via email to Liz Edwards at Liz.Edwards@campbellcountywy.gov
 - Via printed pictures delivered to the **Fair Office ONLY**. Office Hours: Monday – Friday, 8:30am – 5:00pm
 - Fill out the information form on the back side of this page or go to the website (address on back) and bring in or email info in with your pictures.
 - DEADLINE:** All Beef Pictures and Tag information **MUST BE** received by **5pm, Monday, February 7th**. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
 - It is your responsibility to contact the Fair Office to confirm receipt of your photos before February 7th. Photos received after 5pm on February 7th, **WILL NOT** be accepted and the exhibitor will not be allowed to show that beef at County and State Fair. REMEMBER, if you haven't received an email confirmation that your pictures were received, please call and ask.

November 8th, 2021

AMERICAN PLEDGE: Led by Ben

4-H PLEDGE: Led by Sam

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Will moved to approve the minutes as printed, Aly second it, and motion passes.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Kim reported that the council has \$33,691.05 in the checking account and \$6,127.54 in the savings account. Lee moved to approve the treasurers report, Sam second it, and motion passes. Kim brought up the opportunity for an endowment with the state. We did \$20,000 about 10 years ago and have made \$8,500.00 in interest. There was discussion if we should we do this again. Funds that go into the endowment cannot be touched but will make interest into the liability account. Funds in the liability account make interest as well, but can be requested at any time. It was decided that we table this discussion until the January meeting; Shannon moved to approve the discussion, Sam second it, and motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS: The executive committee met and prepared a budget. There were a few changes; a decrease in the bookkeeping line as the treasurer position will now be voluntary and a decrease in the leader development line. The last change was the wording of the request of funds for contests or trips; requests are up to the discretion of the 4-H Council. Katie moved to approve the budget and changes presented, Aly second it, and motion passes. Council positions that are up for election this year are Vice-President and Treasurer. The nominations are Sandi Synder for Vice-President and Jody Fenster for Treasurer. Kristi moved to approve the nominations and election of officers as nominated, Sam second it, and motion passed. Chili Bingo will be February 12th at the Central Pavilion and will be discuss more at the January meeting. The council bought dog food and donated to the animal shelter in honor of Linda Lynch's mom's memorial.

SPECIAL REQUESTS: Heidi Vossler with Crossroads would like permission to sell Rada Cutlery. Funds will be used for camp and club community services. Jody moved to approve the request, Aly second it, and motion passes.
