When reflecting, the group looks back at what they have already done, if more needs to be done, and if so if there is a better way to perform the task. Service learning not only helps out whoever is being served, but also who is doing the service.

So what can you do today that is service learning? One of my favorite service learning projects is that of encouragement. You send someone an inspirational quote, a quick "thinking of you" text or card, give them a hug, or even just a gif to make their day brighter. You analyze how they respond and if maybe something else would cheer them up more. So I encourage you to go out today and perform a service learning project and benefit the community around you!

Youth Livestock Sale (YLS) MANDATORY MEETING!!! ALL YOUTH WITH MARKET LIVESTOCK PROJECTS BEEF - SWINE - LAMB - GOAT - RABBIT - POULTRY

** You must be enrolled in and have paid dues in 4-H and FFA **

<u>ATTENTION</u> - All 4-H and FFA members who will be showing a market animal at the Campbell County Fair and are intending to sell that animal at the Youth Livestock Sale must attend!!! There will be a 15% commission charged on all animals selling at the Youth Livestock Sale. However, a youth can have their commission reduced to 5% by completing the following items 1-3:

- **1.** Attend one of the YLS Mandatory Informational Meetings (dates, times, & locations are below).
 - a. At the Mandatory Meeting, fill out a W-9 for tax purposes You must bring your social security number with you to the meeting. It is highly recommended that all youth, but especially First & Second year livestock members (regardless of age), attend with a parent or guardian.
