Find ways to enjoy the whole process, find your community, and try and try again!



March 14, 2022, 4-H Council meeting minutes

President Deana called the meeting to order at 7:03pm.

American Pledge: Led by Ben

4-H Pledge: Led by Sam

Secretary's report: Bridger moved to approve the minutes as printed. Landon seconded them, and motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Jody reported that the council checking account has \$29,533.24 and the council's savings has \$6,647.34 in them. Jody reported that Chili Bingo brought in \$1,772.00, including a \$200 donation, with \$415.30 in expenses. The total earned from Chili Bingo was \$1,356.70. Sam moved to approve the treasurer's report. Morgan seconded it and motion carried. Vice President thanked those that helped and those that attended the Chili Bingo. Kim brought up the Endowment and the Liability accounts and asked what the Council suggested we do with them. Council suggested taking \$5000.00 from savings and \$5000.00 from checking to place into the Liability account (through the Wyoming State 4-H Foundation) in order to make it easily accessible if needed. The balance of \$29,000 of the line items are a budgeted amount that may not be fully used. Therefore, being able to move the \$5,000 from the line items into the Liability account, makes it easier to utilize. The Liability account makes ore interest than the Endowment does, making the return on the investment higher. Shannon moved to take the \$5000 from checking and \$5000 from savings and transfer them to the Liability account. Sam seconded the motion and it carried. Kim will check into the minimum amount that savings needs to have in it to avoid any issues.

Special Requests: Wild Horse requested to do a homemade craft and bake sale, through donations, on April 30, 2022, at Bomgaars from 10-3. They will be raising money to purchase some animals through the World Vision organization. They expect to make \$750, which is enough to cover the cost of the animals. Riley moved to accept their request and Tuff moved to second it. Motion carried. Riley, with Rusty Spurs, requested to sell coffee from Cherry Bean Coffee Company during May, and a bake sale with lemonade stand at Wright Days in June. Money earned will help provide food for the Wright Free Pantry in Wright. Estimated amount to be earned is around \$1400 in all. Morgan moved to accept the request and Bridger seconded it. Motion carried. Jody with Clover Express asked forgiveness for their concessions at the Hunter's Safety classes in Wright on March 11-13, 2022. They made \$30.55. Jody asked permission to sell the World-Famous Chocolate Bars starting in April until sold out. Estimated amount to be earned is \$500. Landon moved to approve (and forgive) the requests and Riley seconded it. Motion carried. Adon Road Country Kids reported on a bake sale they had that made \$570 that they used for banners for fair stalls. They made \$711 on another bake sale in October of 2021.

Kim thanked the volunteers and youth who helped with the Children's Festival on March 12. She also discussed the upcoming Jump into Judging on March 19 & 20. Deadline to sign up is March 15, 2022. Cloverbuds will have two classes during Project week. One will be on Food and Nutrition and the other is Aerospace. Cloverbuds also has a class coming up about gardening with the Master Gardeners guidance. Young leaders have a fun day planned for April. Camp registration opens April 1. Shearing School will be April 1 & 2. Purple Up Day for supporting the Military will be April 15. Both Celeste and Kim will be gone sometime in April.

Celeste reminded everyone that the Jackpot shoot is April 2nd at the Wright Ag Complex. Pre-registration is open. Needle Fancy Spin Club is going on from April through end of May. New business: Deana will be teaching another Hunter Safety Class April 29 & 30 and May 1 in Gillette. Kim reported that Rabbit and Poultry will have a May Day, Hay Day on May 1st. Topics to be covered will be Showmanship, basic care, breed ID, rabbit tattooing, and bathing birds. It will start at 1pm and place is TBD. She also spoke about Square being set up in a person's email account that is inaccessible, and they no longer work for the Extension Office. Kim said they would have to shut down the old account and start a new one.
