# Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting

7 February 2022 Cottonwood Room, GAMB – Gillette WY

The February Steering Committee Meeting was called to order by President Diane Monahan at 5:16pm. A quorum was established, and introductions were made.

Attending the meeting was Rich Kistler, Linette West, Cathy Crain, Diane Monahan, Suzy Blakesley, Shannon Hudson, and Mandy Reynolds, Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator.

Shannon brought up that the minutes from November and January need to be reviewed and approved during the meeting.

#### The agenda was reviewed:

Treasurer's Report was given. Cathy stated that we have income from the tree sale. We have also had numerous expenses, including GPA for the camera system for the GLEE classes, insurance, square fees, agricultural license, and ordering trees. Treasure Boller in the Extension Office conducted the audit. She recommended reconciling some checks that have never cleared. She also recommends checks need to be cleared after x amount of time, and if not, that individual needs to be contacted. We can have it printed on the checks that they are to be voided after x number of days. Since we still have numerous checks, Cathy will contact the bank to see if we can write it on the checks we have, hand stamp them, or if we would need to order new ones.

#### Old Business:

The January GLEE: Jumpstarting Your Garden, went really well! There were 38 attendees at the Gillette library and 10 attendees at the Wright Branch Library. We rented the GPA camera equipment to video the class in Gillette and it is on our YouTube channel. For the cost, it is definitely worth it! The GLEE schedule for the year is available.

Copies of the budget, GLEE schedule, agenda, and committee sign-ups are on the side table.

Rich Kistler moved to approve the November minutes as written. Suzy Blakesley seconded it. Motion carried. Cathy Crain moved to approve the January minutes as written. Mary Schoen seconded it. Motion carried.

Cathy Crain gave the treasurer's report as our 2022 Treasurer. Cathy stated that we have income from the tree sale. We had numerous expenses, GPA for the camera system for the GLEE classes, insurance, square fees, agricultural license, and ordering trees. Treasure Boller in the Extension Office conducted the audit. She recommended reconciling some checks that have never cleared. She also recommends checks need to be cleared after x amount of time, and if not, that individual needs to be contacted. We can have it printed on the checks that they are to be voided after x number of days. Since we still have numerous checks, Cathy will contact the bank to see if we can write it on the checks we have, hand stamp them, or if we would need to order new ones. At this time Cathy will reconcile the debit charges that show up in our books and not in the bank statements.

The January GLEE: Jumpstarting Your Garden, went really well! There were 38 attendees at the Gillette library and 10 attendees at the Wright Branch Library. Patsy had suggested taking part of the seed library down to Wright, so the demonstrators took three displays full of seeds. We rented the GPA camera equipment to video the class in Gillette and it is on our YouTube channel. To find the video, type in YouTube Campbell County Master Gardeners. So far there are 71 views on YouTube! Renting the equipment is definitely worth it! Building a video library is a great addition to the program. February 15<sup>th</sup> is the next class, which will be on houseplants!

Bill Brown, MG Trainee, offered to teach a Public Speaking/Lecturing Seminar for Master Gardeners. If there is enough interest, he is willing to put something together for March. We originally had him scheduled for February, but March would work better for him. His profession is teaching public speaking and giving presentations. Due to the length of the class, and Bill's preferences, a Saturday would work best for him. By show of hands, there is definitely an interest.

- Teresa Norton is the chair for tree sale committee. She was not present, so Mandy spoke on her behalf. Everything is going well so far with the tree sale. As of last week, 2,217 trees were sold. Forms for the large lots as well as the individual trees are available both in the office and online. We are not getting any trees from Colorado State this year, as they only had Ponderosa Pines. The Conservation District really is not doing much this year. Towner State Forestry in North Dakota is where we are getting the evergreens this year. We are looking at having our tree sale the first week of May. The trees are scheduled to be delivered to Teresa's shop sometime between April 21<sup>st</sup> through the last week of April. It was brought up to possibly get trees from Montana, but Mandy says they are not shipping right now. No one seems to have trees right now, due to the lack of workers or truck drivers. It was asked how often the tree sale committee meets. The committee met in November and has not since. First National Bank has purchased 1000 trees again and will be giving these away. The set up will be the same as last year, where they gave them out during our tree sale. This works really well for us, as it brings people in to pick up their trees that might not otherwise be there.
- The purpose of the Nominating Committee is to try to get people to run for offices, no one is currently signed up.
- Rich Kistler is the Chair for the Garden Walk, it will be in July. He is hoping for six homes as well as business sponsorship. The committee will start looking for houses/gardens next month.
