Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting 4 April 2022 Cottonwood Room, GAMB – Gillette WY

The April Steering Committee Meeting was called to order by President Diane Monahan at 5:17. A quorum was established, and introductions were made.

Attending the meeting was Diane Monahan, Shannon Hudson, Heather Kleiner, Cathy Crain, Rich Kistler, Linette West, Katie Hudson, and Mandy Reynolds, Campbell County Horticulture Program Coordinator.

The agenda was reviewed:

Cathy gave the treasurer's report. She stated how much the tree sale has brought in this far as well as where we were this time last year for the tree sale. She stated our expenses for the last month included paying GPA, Facebook advertising, and reimbursing Heather for an education conference and speaker gift from 2021. There is also a debit charge that was for notebooks to be handed out at the GLEE meetings. During the regular meeting, we will need to decide where these funds will be coming from. After discussion, the Steering Committee has decided to recommend moving the funds from advertising/postcards, advertising/social media, education-al materials, and supplies for classes.

Old Business:

The March GLEE meeting was on March 15th at the Gillette Library. The focus was on pollinators and square foot gardening. There were 51 attendees. This was repeated on March 29th at the Wright Library, where they had 8 attendees. The April GLEE meeting will be featuring Scott Skogerboe as he discusses trees and shrubs. This will begin at 1 in the Cottonwood Room at the GAMB for the public and then he will continue afterwards with the Master Gardeners. There is a sign-up sheet on the side table.

There has been some questions and concerns regarding whether Master Gardeners are eligible for the giveaways during GLEE meetings. After much discussion, the Steering Committee has decided that if a Master Gardener is there for the class as a participant, not a speaker, they are indeed eligible for the giveaways. All attendees that want a ticket is eligible to get one, as long as they are not presenting.

Campbell County Master Gardeners Regular Meeting 4 April 2022 Cottonwood Room, GAMB – Gillette WY

The April Master Gardener Meeting was called to order by President Diane Monahan at 6:03. A quorum was established, and introductions were made.

Attending the meeting was Bill Brown, Karen Chitwood, Fawn Conrad, Catherine Crain, Priscilla Hixson, Katie Hudson, Shannon Hudson, Sandra Hunter, Rich Kistler, Heather Kleiner, Jody Kruse, Patsy Larson, Audrey Mertz, Diane Monahan, Teresa Norton, Mandy Reynolds, Janet Thompson, and Linette West.

The March minutes were reviewed. Diane pointed out that in the regular meeting minutes it states, "The February Master Gardener Meeting was called to order..." rather than "The March Master Gardener Meeting was called to order...". Jody Kruse moved to approve the minutes with the stated amendment. Sandra Hunter seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Diane then explained we needed more notebooks for the GLEE classes, so they were ordered. We would like to do a lineitem transfer to show in the budget where the funds actually comes from for these. AS such, the steering committee suggests moving the funds from advertising/postcards, advertising/social media, educational materials, and supplies for classes. Rich made a motion to do so. Theresa seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Cathy then gave the treasurer's report. Along with the funds spent on the notebooks, we also spent funds on GPA, Facebook advertising and reimbursing Heather for an education conference and speaker gift from 2021. She also stated the comparison of where we were last year compared to this year for the tree sale. We are doing better this year thus far.

Tree Sale Committee: We originally ordered 70 apple trees, but just cancelled 30, as they are not selling as quickly as we are comfortable with. If you have disposable pots, we could really use them for the tree sale! We need to see what is alive from last year at the Camplex. There should be some pots available to use at the Community Garden as well.

We need to decide what discount the Master Gardeners get and when, be it all orders or only on the day of the sale. After much discussion, it was decided that if you place a presale order you may full price. If you purchase at the day of the sale, Master Gardeners receive a 20% discount.

The Tree Sale is set up for May 5^{th} from 8 to 5:30. After discussing with the Master Gardeners at large, it was decided to change things up. We will now be doing set-up and preorders/sale on Wednesday, March 4^{th} , and then the Tree sale on May 5^{th} from 7:30 AM to 7:30 PM. There is a need for large boxes. Crazy Daisy and Forget Me Not both receive flower shipments on Tuesdays, so Teresa will get boxes from Linette (Crazy Daisy) and Rich (Forget Me Not). We will be sending out postcards regarding the Tree Sale.
