

Important Rabbit Info!

This is just a reminder that Rabbit ID's are due to the Extension Office by 5:00 pm on June 1st. One is enclosed for your convenience. Below are some items of importance for the Rabbit Project!

- **Rabbit ID's are due to the Extension Office by 5:00pm on June 1st.** All rabbits must have permanent tattoo identification numbers or letters in the left ear. (Please see pages 90-91 of the Fair Book)
- **You must declare that you are taking a Meat Pen on the Rabbit ID.** Meat Pen rabbits can be purchased after June 1st of the current year. **Meat Pen rabbits must be in the exhibitor's possession and a head shot photograph, with left ear tattoo visible, submitted to the Fair Office as of the entry deadline - July 11, 2022.**
- If you have a rabbit that needs tattooed, please contact Cara Binder at 307-689-8455, Meghan Davies at 307-391-1026 or Sharon Adels at 307-682-8181 one of them will help you!
- New this year.... Senior Champion showman in Rabbit and Poultry will be allowed to participate in the large animal Round Robin on August 6th at 5:00 pm

RABBIT RHDV

WHAT IS RHDV?
Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV) is a highly contagious disease caused by a calicivirus that affects rabbits.


TREATMENT
There is no known cure for RHDV. Treatment is supportive care in isolation

SYMPTOMS
Affected rabbits may die suddenly without symptoms, or may show neurologic signs such as incoordination, excessive excitement or convulsions prior to death. Most will have difficulty breathing and may have a bloody discharge from the nose.

Unfortunately the only symptom is sudden death and blood around the mouth and nose from internal bleeding.



Another sign of RHDV is jaundice (yellowing) of the whites of eyes

Requirements: Age - Up to 65 days and 3 to 5 pounds at County Fair, up to 80 days and 3 1/2 to 5 1/2 pounds at State Fair. NOTE: Only one pen per exhibitor will be allowed to qualify for State Fair.
