1. Go to <https://4h.zsuite.org/> (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer)
2. Click **Sign Up**
 - Fill in the required fields (you can use your same email and password from 4HOnline).

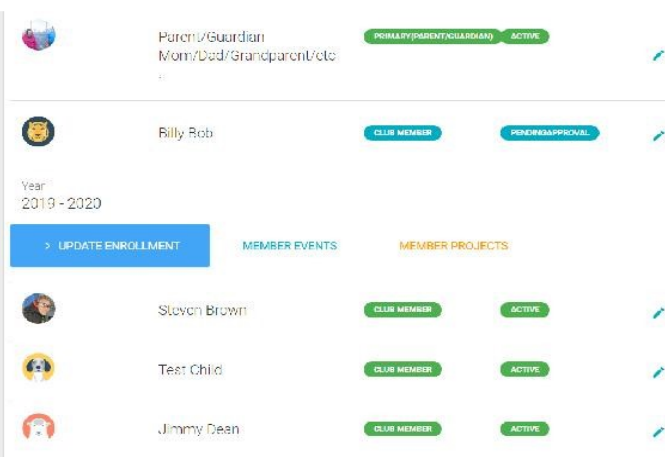
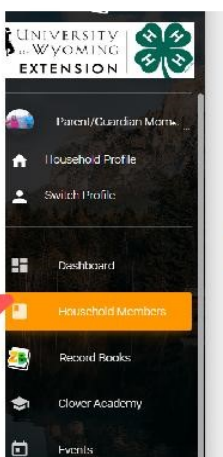


- Create a pin number (we recommend an easy to remember four-digit number, like the last four numbers of your phone number).

 - Select Wyoming and your home County.
3. Click **Let's Go**

1. To add members, in the black drop down menu, select household members.

3. Fill in the required fields for one of your members.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Riley moved to approve the minutes as printed in the newsletter, Katie second it, and motion passes

TREASURER'S REPORT: Jody reported that the council has \$24,034.99 in the checking account and \$1,783.28 in the savings account. Kylie moved to approve the treasurers report, Riley second it, and motion passes.

Thank you's were read for scholarships given in the spring. Chili Bingo is set for January 28th, we will talk about it more after the November council meeting.

SPECIAL REQUESTS: Kaitlyn and Kylie requested to be allowed to sell raffle tickets to aid in the Horse Quiz Bowl. They will be selling them through October 2nd and tickets are for a gun/turkey hunt/gift card basket. Funds will go towards travel and hotels. Riley moved to approve the request, Sam second it, and motion passes. The Wool Judging team would like permission to sell cotton candy at the Pumpkin Patch on October 22nd at the Methodist Church. They would also like to sell baked goods and crafts at the Christmas farmers market on December 10th. Funds will go towards various trips. Katie moved to approve both requests, Will second it, and motion passes. Riley with the Rusty Spurs club requested that they be allowed to do a bake sale on October 7th at Dons in Wright for 4-H week. Funds will go towards t-shirts for their club. Meghan moved to approve the fundraiser, Kristi second it, and motion passes. Wild Horse reported that they made \$1,002.72 at their bake and craft sale at Bomgaars; \$750.00 went to World Vision. It was decided that we will have 5 to 7 clubs per council meeting have an officer/member or as many members as possible attend the meeting and report what is going on within their clubs.
