The GLEE recording for June is not up yet, but will be soon. Willows were given as giveaways.

There are a lot of yard calls coming into the extension office. It was asked if anyone was interested in volunteering. Sandra Hunter is willing to help with garden calls. Rich reported on the Urban Orchard. He already has nine houses that are interested for next year. The Garden Walk will be taking place from 9 to 4. Rather than meeting at the plaza, we will be meeting at City Park this year. This is due to insurance costs being more than we have budgeted. We will be meeting there at 7 AM.

Tickets are 1 for \$5, 6 for \$5, or 30 for \$25 for the raffle. After discussion, we will be switching it to 30 tickets for \$20 so that if you purchase more tickets, you are saving more money. We need to get pictures of the baskets and get laminated sheets at the houses.

We need to have snacks made for the refreshments after the walk, during the raffle drawing. Sandra volunteered Heather and herself to bring cookies. Diane Monahan also volunteered, and Suzy volunteered to purchase some. Mandy will bring the drinks and cups. Mary did the Bios and did a wonderful job on those.

The North Community Garden will be opened to drop off the baskets after the parade. They will then be taken to the down-town businesses. Sandi has already spoken to the businesses, so they are expecting them.

Linette is in charge of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July float. WE will be meeting on June 30<sup>th</sup> at 9 AM at the old Ice Arena to decorate it. She is bringing water. WE are asked to bring dishes of food to share after the decorating is done. Sandi Aberle will be wearing the bee costume for the parade. Sandra Hunter said she can walk in the parade. The parade is at ten, but we are unsure what time we are meeting.

So far we have ten businesses sponsoring the garden walk. We do not have money in hand, so this number could change.

We would like two individuals at each house/location during the Garden Walk. So far we have Sandi Aberle and Shannon Hudson at the Urban Orchard, Diane Monahan and Sandra Hunter at Knollwood, Synneva and Kathryne at 703 Carey, and Linette and Mary at City Park. We will need more volunteers!

Jody Kruse, Mandy Reynolds, Sandi Aberle and possibly Suzy Blakesley will be helping transport the flower pots from downtown to City Park.

On July 6<sup>th</sup>, we will meet at the extension office at 3 PM to go look at the gardens that are in the Garden Walk. We will finalize details when we meet.

#### Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting August 8, 2022 Camplex Park, Pavilion 4 – Gillette WY

The August Steering Committee Meeting was called to order by President Diane Monahan at 5:17 PM. A quorum was established.

Attending the meeting was Rich Kistler, Heather Kleiner, Diane Monahan, Cathy Crain, Suzy Blakesley, Mandy Reynolds, Katie Hudson, Sandi Aberle, Shannon Hudson, and Linette West.

The agenda was reviewed:

The minutes for the July meeting are attached to the agenda to review tonight.

Cathy Crain gave the treasurer's report. The Garden walk brought in some funds, however not as much as it did last year. We did have sponsors this year, however even with those, we did not bring in as much funds. Expenses for the last month included FaceBook ads, sales tax, and county fair awards. We will be getting two of those checks back, as they were not awarded this year. Linette also had expenses for the float that we need to pay her back.

During the meeting, we want to review the Garden Walk, including what went well and what we may want to change.

The budget also needs to be looked over as we are about \$2000 less than where we wanted to be at this point.

The remaining GLEE classes for 2022 need to be reviewed. August is supposed to be vermiculture, but we do not have a time or date. For September, we are looking at overwintering bulbs, garlic, and other plants, but we do not know who or when. Sandi offered to teach regarding the garlic or bulbs. She can do other plants as well but feels it would be better to have an additional speaker. The group as a whole will be asked if anyone wants to teach about overwintering other plants. October is supposed to be Rich and Diane working together doing pumpkin succulents. Rich and Diane need to get together to get this planned and pick a date. It was brought up that the pumpkins and succulents can be preordered. Rich will talk with Walmart tomorrow (August 9<sup>th</sup>) to look into this. November is supposed to be taking care of Christmas plants, such as Christmas cacti, amaryllis, poinsettia, and possibly little trees. Sandi Aberle will be gone at that point, so we need to see if anyone else is interested. If not, Sandi may be able to do it over zoom. At all of these meetings, we need at least two people to help with the set-up ad tear down.

The State Master Gardener Conference is quickly coming up! We need a head count. There is a signup sheet on the clipboard on the center table. Registration and hotel are usually covered by the group, as long as there is at least two Master Gardeners per room. Today is the last day to register. September 16<sup>th</sup> through the 18<sup>th</sup> is the Jolly Lane Chili Pepper Festival.

Pollinator count is on Wednesday, 10 August 2022, at 1215. We would like to get a head count.

Do we want to give thank you gifts to Plant Shack, Rayne Gardens, Forget Me Not Floral, Crazy Daisy, Wyoming Art and Frame, and who else? Plant Shack goes way above! Sandi Aberle has actually already taken thank you's and fused glass plant stakes to Plant Shack and Rayne Gardens.

Mandy reported on her Horticulture Program Coordinator's Comments. For the State MG Conference, she will email the attendees so that all can work out the arrangements. Kris Jones from the Prairie Community Garden donated six embroidered tea towels. They are stunning! Mandy has copies of the Wyoming Vegetable and Fruit Growing Guide available in her office. We just need to stop by to pick one up.

The next Master Gardener meeting is September 12<sup>th</sup>. Does anyone want to host?

Suzy brought up the stakes that the park usually puts Christmas lights on in the winter. Right now they are bare. Do we as Master Gardeners want to start hanging something on them during the Summer, such as flags, to advertise the Urban orchard? She believes there are eleven or twelve of them.

Patsy brought a plant from Jan Rock to give away as a door prize.

#### Campbell County Master Gardeners Regular Meeting August 8, 2022 Camplex Park, Pavilion 4 – Gillette WY

The August Master Gardener Meeting was called to order by President Diane Monahan at 6:02 PM. A quorum was established.

Attending the meeting were Sandi Aberle, Suzy Blakesley, Bill Brown, Fawn Conrad, Catherine Crain, Katie Hudson, Shannon Hudson, Sandra Hunter, Rich Kistler, Heather Kleiner, Jody Kruse, Patsy Larson, Audrey Mertz, Diane Monahan, Teresa Norton, Shawna Stephens, Janet Thompson, Linette West, and Mandy Reynolds.

Copies of the steering committee and regular meeting minutes for July were passed out to all attending members. Suzy made a motion to approve minutes as written. Teresa seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Cathy then gave the treasurer's report. We raised less funds this year with the Garden Walk than we did last year, even with the business sponsors. Expenses this past month included Facebook ads, sales tax, and county fair awards. Two awards were not given out at fair, so those checks should be returned. Linette also turned in receipts for the float and will need to be reimbursed.

The Garden Walk was then discussed. There were many that feel tickets need to be available earlier. Some members of the public say they did not even know it was happening. There seemed to be a 3 to 1 ratio of people thinking it was alright to have a newer garden on the garden walk. Others did not like that a newer garden was on it. There were definitely mixed reviews. Some really liked seeing the struggle, as it is real life, and some really want to see it in a couple years to see how it looks then. There were a lot of comments regarding the lack thereof or needing to advertise more/better. Others brought up the fact that there was no information regarding the Master Gardener program. Perhaps we could have a half sheet or flyer at the houses. We could also go back to the post cards. We could perhaps use the advertising budgets for events, including for GLEE, MG class, Garden Walk, etc. Diane got lots of comments regarding her MG shirt as well. It was also brought up that we may need to end earlier.... As it gets pretty hot in the later afternoon. The central location was also brought up. We use to draw the raffle at the Third Street Plaza. There was more traffic there. Perhaps next year we could have it at Lasting Legacy. The citizens could also possibly plant something. Bill Brown volunteered to write something up to really "sell" what we are doing, as well. Talking on the radio was also brought up. It was also stated that a lot of people did not come due to political issues and the library situation. As Master Gardeners, we need to keep our focus on the fact that our "job" and purpose is to educate. For next year, we need to start earlier. We could take a general overview of the happenings to the GLEE meetings starting in January. We may even get more house nominations that way. The 4<sup>th</sup> of July will be on a Tuesday in 2023, so that will be when the parade is. As the garden walk is always the following Saturday, we may want to get the raffle items downtown earlier than normal and only put a few on the parade float.

As we are eight months into our budget, we should review the budget at home for up to this date, and if we have any questions, please call Diane or Mandy.

A copy of the upcoming GLEE meetings was passed out. We need to start having two people to help set up and two people to help tear down.

August: Composting/Season Extension – Rich will get ahold of Jared Green and see what his thoughts are on this, and when he is available for in Gillette. Diane Monahan can discuss about worms and vermicomposting. Sandi Aberle can discuss about using PVC pipes. We are already set up to go down to Wright on August 29<sup>th</sup>.

September: Overwintering bulbs/ Garlic/ and plants – Sandi Aberle is willing to talk about overwintering garlic and bulbs. Heather will contact Sage Bear about what she does with her plants for the winter.

October: Pumpkin Succulents – Rich and Diane are going to get together to plan this. We will need to advertise for this. There will probably need to be a \$20 fee to participate to help cover the cost of the pumpkins and succulents.

November: Taking care of Christmas Plants – Christmas Cactus, Amaryllis, Poinsettia, and maybe little trees – Sandi will be gone in November, though she is willing to zoom if needed. We could also ask Nate from Rayne Gardens.

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Signups for the State Master Gardener Conference close today. If you have or are registering for this, please also sign up on the clipboard on the central table. Those going will be emailed so that arrangements can be made regarding carpooling and rooms. The Master Gardeners reimburse for the registration costs as well as the rooms as long as two master gardeners are staying in the room. If you plan to stay in the room by yourself or with your spouse who is not a member, only half the room will be reimbursed. We are donating items for a basket. Linette brought in items tonight. If you have anything to donate, please bring it to Mandy.

The Jolly Lane Chili Pepper Festival is September 16<sup>th</sup> through the 18<sup>th</sup>. This event happens over in Rapid City, SD. If you are interested, please sign up on the clipboard on the sign-up sheet. We are thinking Saturday may be the better day to attend.

The next Pollinator Count is Wednesday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, at 12:15 PM. It is always the second Wednesday at 12:15. We are trying to get a head count, as it is often times one or two Master Gardeners and the Hudson children. Sandi, Shannon, Janet, Fawn, Cathy, Katie, and Rich will try to be there this month.

Who should we give thank you gifts to? Sandi Aberle has already written thank yous and given fused glass plant stakes to Plant Shack and Rayne Gardens. Perhaps we could give them, as well as to Forget Me Not Floral, Crazy Daisy, Wyoming Art and Frame, First Interstate Bank and Landon's, a thank you card and invitation to something, such as the Awards Banquet in January.
