Unlike other extracurricular activities, 4-H is completely up to you. We have very few deadlines and requirements. You must have active status before being involved in the 4-H program which means enrolling at https://4h.zsuite.org/ & paying your enrollment dues. There is so much more to do with the program to make it fit your needs. In 4-H, there are various levels in which to be involved:

Clubs: There are currently 28 clubs here in Campbell County. These clubs do a variety of activities. The state asks that clubs offer project work and community service. To say the least, the options are endless! Please check in with your club leader to see what you can do to get involved!

County: We offer a lot of programming thanks to our wonderful volunteers! We have a very large and successful program in Horse, Livestock, Shooting Sports, & Young Leaders. There are various classes offered throughout the year— on this year's agenda is Robotics, Food & Nutrition, Photography, Leathercraft, Judgings, etc. There are a series of classes in Cake Decorating, Cats, Dogs, Fabric & Fashion, Poultry, Rabbits! If there is something you are interested in, please let us know and we will try to get a class scheduled. Then we offer lots of events! We hope that you will attend Chili Bingo, the Children's Festival, 4-H Camp, Achievement Night, and join in at the Campbell County Fair.

State: Wyoming 4-H provides many opportunities for you to get involved. There are camps, trainings, and competitions. Check into the Horse Camp, State Volunteer trainings, Shooting Sports trainings, State Wool & Meats Judging, Showcase Showdown, State Shoot, Wyoming State Fair, and the State Leadership Team!

National & International: As early as 7th grade, 4-Her's can begin to travel with the Leadership Washington Focus. Wyoming 4-H sponsors travel for teens to Citizen Washington Focus, National 4-H Congress, National 4-H Conference, Western National Roundup, and International Trips currently to Ireland and Belize.





Enrolling in Wyoming 4-H

- 1. Go to https://4h.zsuite.org/ (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer)
- 2. Click Sign Up
- Fill in the required fields (you can use your same email and password from 4HOnline).






- Create a pin number (we recommend an easy to remember four-digit number, like the last four numbers of your phone number).
 - REMEMBER your password and pin number, you will need it to access your enrollment!
- Select Wyoming and your home County.
- 3. Click Let's Go
