Campbell County Master Gardeners Regular Meeting

July 10, 2023 Linette West's home – Gillette WY

The July Master Gardener Meeting was called to order by President Rich Kistler at 6:10 PM. A quorum was established. Thank you, Linette, for hosting us in your lovely yard! A quorum was established, and introductions were made. Along with the introductions, each attendee was encouraged to discuss his/her garden. We also enjoyed loaded nachos and fruit provided by Linette (thank you!).

Attending the meeting were Rich Kistler, Sandi Aberle, Cathy Crain, Heather Kleiner, Jody Kruse, Katie Hudson, Linette West, Audrey Mertz, Marita Roussey, Sandra Hunter, Sharon Murphree, Anne Ziegenhorn, Suzy Blakesley, Kathryne Schwartz, and Shannon Hudson.

The minutes from June were reviewed. Sandi had noticed that the discussion regarding purchasing the trees was not in the minutes. Suzy moved to approve the minutes as written with the addition of the discussion/approval of purchasing trees from Plant Shack. Anne seconded it and motion was carried. Sandi reported that Plant Shack will order our trees in November for a Spring delivery. Right now, we are looking at two apricots, two plums and possibly two Compass cherries.

Cathy presented the Treasurer's Report. The deposits for the month included interest from the checking and savings account, as well as a donation from First Interstate Bank for the Garden Walk planter. Expenses included the camera rental for GLEE.

The CD committee has not met as of this meeting.

The June GLEE was on Bees Bugs, and Butterflies. It was held in Gillette on the 15th and in Wright on the 20th. The children at the Gillette GLEE outnumbered the adults and were very involved, yelling out the answers. Both the children and the adults were given homework, consisting of looking for bees, bug, and butterflies in their own gardens, and turning it in to the extension office in September for the chance at winning fused glass plant stakes.

The Garden walk was this past Saturday. The park looked beautiful – thank you Suzy! This year, attendees commented that there were things they saw that they could go home and replicate in their own yards and gardens. A lot of tickets were purchased the day of! Due to how things were recorded, we cannot tell profit for the tickets versus for the walk.

The Pollinator Count will be this Wednesday at the Urban Orchard, 12 July 2023, at 1215. Please be sure to try to help. Last month was just Shannon and her children. Shannon will pick up the clipboards and supplies for the count. The trees there in the Urban Orchard also need to be weeded. It was set up so that Suzy takes care of the area around the trees, but we need to remove the cages and weed them. We also need to see where we are with the trees being "assigned" to individuals to care for. Also, the nine flags that were bought are too small. Perhaps we can put them around the orchard.

Does anyone want to help with the newsletter so that it does not all fall on Mandy's plate? It was suggested to speak with Bill Brown, as he is great with words. Rich will reach out to him.

Communication seems to be lacking in some areas for the Master Gardeners. Not everyone reads their emails or they go to spam/junk, but at the same time, not everyone texts either. It was recommended to look at other apps. GroupMe and Band were suggested. Sandi Aberle, Katie Hudson, and Rich Kistler will look into what might work for the Master Gardeners.

How do we get new trainees involved and staying? In the past we would adopt new volunteers. Rich is going to call the new trainees see how we can get people involved and staying. A mixer was suggested. It has also been suggested to only have regular meetings four times a year, and during the other months do something fun or a learning experience for us. Rich will have a report for us at the next meeting showing what the new people say. Audrey also pointed out that in order to have younger generations, the meetings and activities need to be after work, but not too late so that young children can be cared for.
