Campbell County Master Gardeners Steering Committee Meeting September 11, 2023 Sandi Aberle's home – Gillette WY

The September Steering Committee Meeting was called to order by President Rich Kistler at 5:17pm. A quorum was established. Thank you, Sandi, for hosting us in your beautiful and fruitful backyard. We really appreciate the three ladies – Linette, Cathy, and Sandi – who hosted us in their homes/yards this year!

Attending the meeting were Rich Kistler, Cathy Crain, Sandi Aberle, Linette West, Mandy Reynolds, and Shannon Hudson.

The agenda was reviewed:

The August minutes will need to be reviewed and approved.

Cathy Crain gave the Treasurer's report. Deposits this past month were \$164.20 for the sale of the books at the Herb Festival, interest for checking account was \$2.03 and the interest for the savings account was \$0.09. Expenses included the gift cards for the ladies in the extension office at \$316.32, boosting ads on Facebook for \$150.00, Fair awards cashed thus far at \$75, and the purchase of an apple tree for the Urban Orchard from the Plant Shack for \$44.09. We need to discuss possibly using some funds for fencing the Urban Orchard.

The University of Wyoming decided to split the job that was previously held by Chris Hilgert. There will now be a State Master Gardener Coordinator and a State Extension Specialist. Donna Hoffman has taken the position of the State Master Gardener Coordinator. She will also continue being the Natrona County Coordinator as well. The State Extension Specialist still needs to be hired.

The 2024 State Conference is only a year away! Would we be interested in hosting? There has been a discussion that the county coordinators would be in charge of the classes. Sandi will look into this at the state meeting.

Theresa, who has done a fabulous job in the past, will no longer be able to be the Tree Sale Chair. We need to see if anyone is interested.

We need to schedule a Tree Sale meeting here soon, however Lincoln Oakes does not have their order form ready yet. It is from there that we order many of our trees.

The Education/GLEE committee also needs to meet in the near future. After elections in November would be the most beneficial. We may be able to do this as a zoom call.

The September GLEE class is Hydroponics and Growing Inside. Sandi is working on putting a presentation together. The class in Gillette is on the 14th. Due to it being in the Pioneer Rooms, chairs will be set up, but no tables. The October GLEE class will be the Pumpkin Succulent Class. We need to decide on dates, number of people, and number of classes. Sandi, as well as others, have succulents. Home Depot, last time Sandi was there, had low growing sedums as buy one get two free! After discussion, we are thinking we could hold two classes of 20 to 25 people each. The first class could be 10 to 12 and the second class from 2 to 4. Our first choice for a date is October 14th and our second choice is October 7th. It will be \$30 per person.

For our meeting in October, we want to do something fun and have a get together with new members. We have decided on a potluck and an amaryllis class after a quick meeting. To do the amaryllis class, we will need a head count. It will be \$8 to \$12 per amaryllis. For budget purposes, we use the Master Gardener activity budget line.

The Nominating Committee needs to find individuals for offices soon. Nominations and interests need to be to Mandy by November 1st.

In December there needs to be a budget meeting. Chairs need to start thinking about what they will need, fundswise, as prices keep going up.

In January we will have our awards banquet. Next year the budget needs to be upped to at least \$750!

The Pollinator Count is on Wednesday, September 14th, at 1215. We will need people to come help with this. Mandy will not be able to be there. Shannon will pick up the supplies from the Extension office.



Jun Per 2023 Pollinator Counts

DUE SEPT. 15th

Conduct observations in the afternoon between noon and 4pm when temperatures are over 60°F and when skies are clear, partly cloudy, or bright overcast. You can count as long as you can see your shadow and the wind speed is low (gentle breeze). Conduct observations in the same area for

every count. Observe plants evenly over the area for 15 minutes.

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Reports from International Master Gardener Conference 2023



Science based Companion Planting

The general session on Thursday by Jessica Walliser was on companion planting with scientific data to back it up. This was one of the most informative talks I went to. The talk provided answers and reasons why companion planting works. She discussed how interplanting certain plants helped others acquire food, control insects, invite beneficial insects to the garden and improve soil health. It will improve yield productivity and plant health.

Using polycultures [many different plants] in the garden instead of monoculture insures a more healthy and robust garden. Interplanting will help with weeds, pests and diseases and bring in more pollinators. I always remember my grandmother's garden. She planted in rows with certain distance between each plant/row. She kept each group of plants together and did not plant many flowers. She tilled the soil every year. I find this is a hard habit for me to break because of the nostalgia involved but I am working on it even though it makes me uncomfortable.

I highly recommend the book "Plant Partners Science Based Companion Planting Strategies for the Vegetable Garden" by Jessica Walliser.
