Camp Chaperone

YOUR PURPOSE: To provide overnight supervision to 4-H youth. To support 4-H programming efforts as directed by the event staff or 4-H Educator.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

•Participate in 4-H chaperone training. •Assure a safe and healthy environment through support and enforcement of all rules.

•Set a good example for 4-H members at all times. •Know the names and faces of the 4-H members you are chaperoning.

Understand and be willing to follow proper emergency procedures if needed.

Project Leader

YOUR PURPOSE: To help youth develop life skills and help youth learn skills and information about a specific project. RESPONSIBILITIES:

Plan and prepare for project meetings or workshops. This could include workshops, field trips, audio/video resources, guest speakers, teaching kits, or etc

Use and promote project curriculum.

-Be familiar with 4-H rules, policies, guidelines, and deadlines. -Inform members of and encourage participation in other 4-H opportunities related to the project, such as Showcase Showdown, county workshops, county fair, state fair, and awards related to the project area.



YOUR PURPOSE:

To provide leadership to the club by working with youth officers, to oversee the structure and the operation of the club and to be the primary contact person for the club. RESPONSIBILITIES:

Meet regularly with a calendar of planned educational activities (meetings, classes, community service, etc.). It is recommended that clubs meet at least 6 times per year

Sharing the responsibilities among club families

Work with club officers in preparing meeting agendas, learning skills, and carrying out other duties

-Setting up processes to disseminate information in the club and maintain regular contact with UW Educator -Completing annual Club Chartering paperwork
