





Campbell County 4-H Camp is a 4 day wilderness experience in the Black Hills of Wyoming. This camp is for youth to get away, make friends, learn, while enjoying the outdoors.

** You must be enrolled and have dues paid in 4-H and/or FFA **

<u>ATTENTION</u> - All 4-H and FFA members who will be showing a market animal at the Campbell County Fair and are intending to sell that animal at the Youth Livestock Sale must attend!!! There will be a 15% commission charged on all animals selling at the Youth Livestock Sale. However, a youth can have their commission reduced to 5% by completing the following items 1-3:

- 1. Attend one of the YLS Mandatory Informational Meetings (dates, times, & locations are below).
 - At the Mandatory Meeting, fill out a W-9 for tax purposes You must bring your social security number with you to the meeting. It is highly recommended that all youth, but especially First- & Second-year livestock members (regardless of age), attend with a parent or guardian.
 - b. At the Mandatory Meeting, one business will be assigned to you. Personally, visit your business inviting them to the Campbell County Fair and Youth Livestock Sale.
 - A business information sheet will be provided to obtain a signature and they must be returned to the <u>Fair Office</u> by the County Fair Entry Deadline on Monday, JULY 1st, 2024, by 12:00am (midnight) **
