CAMPING AT FAIR

- 1. FEE: A fee of \$100 will be charged for each camper space during the Campbell County Fair. Spaces can be rented through the Campbell County Fair Office.
- 2. SPACE: All campers must keep their space litter free and in a sanitary condition. Rowdiness, profanity or vandalism will not be tolerated. The Fair Board reserves the right to dismiss any offender for reasons satisfactory to itself, without refund. Parents/legal guardians are responsible for their children at all times. All exhibitors camping during Fair MUST have a parent/guardian in the camper to supervise kids during the evening hours of Fair and overnight. Guardians must be of legal age. See Dog Rules in Fair Book online.
- 3. QUIET HOURS: There will be no congregating in any part of the campground past 11:30 pm Sunday through Thursday and 12:00 pm midnight on Friday and Saturday. All kids must be in their campers with the radios and TV's turned down. Parents/guardians must be in the camper at this time.
- 4. CAMPER REGISTRATION: Camping is only allowed in Fair Board designated areas and must be registered through the Fair Office. Violators will be towed at owner's expense. Reservations for campground can be made after January 1st of the current year by calling the Fair Office at 307-687-0200. Prior to parking camper, please check in with the Campground Superintendent or the Fair Office. Payment is due at the time of parking. Once payment is received the Campground Superintendent or Fair Office will issue a camping permit that has the contact information and phone number. The camping permit must be posted on the outside of the camper and be easily readable for emergency contact.



GENERAL POLICIES

- Barn Times:Open 5:00 am Closed/Locked 9 pm Daily.
- Tie- in Time 6-9 am. Tie-Out Time 6-8PM All animals **MUST** be fed, watered and cared for by 9AM in the morning and 8PM in the evening.
- Youth Animal Care Youth members must accompany, care for and exhibit their own livestock at the Campbell County Fair. Fitting is to be done by 4-H or FFA members ONLY. Youth members are expected to accompany, care for, feed, water, groom/ fit, and exhibit their own livestock at the Campbell County Fair. Each Youth member having livestock for show is required to keep his/her alley clean and stalls orderly at all times. However, in the interest of safety and education, a Youth member may be assisted by another active 4-H or FFA member. Assistance is defined as a learning situation, where the person doing the assisting is teaching the youth member a technique in fitting or showing. This 4-H/FFA member is allowed only to educate the youth member the proper skill or techniques, and the youth member is expected to perform the majority of each technique/skill required. Youth member must be involved by actively watching and listening to the person assisting them. Any youth using electronic devices (ex: Cell Phone, etc.) that serve as a distraction during this time will be issued a warning to get involved.

Adults/parents/guardians/leaders will be permitted to help/ assist any 4H or FFA member when it becomes a safety concern while the livestock are on the grounds. No adult/parent/guardian will be permitted to help any 4-H or FFA member fit, block, or show their livestock projects while the livestock are on the grounds. Violations of this policy must be reported to the Superintendent in a timely manner. The Superintendent and/or Fair Coordinator and/or Fair Board will investigate and address the report. If an Exhibitor is found to be in violation of the animal care/fitting policy, he/she may be disqualified from competition, forfeit any premiums/fees/awards already received, and be immediately dismissed from the fairgrounds.

- All non-sale animals released between 5pm 10pm Saturday July 27th
- All feed must be stored outside of the building.

**4-H APPROVED DRESS CODE FOR YOUTH LIVESTOCK AND STATIC INTERVIEWS **

Aa a representative of the Campbell County Fair, all members are required to follow the approved dress codes for all youth shows including showmanship classes, Supreme Cow Contest and Youth Livestock Sale. If clothing and/or accessories become a safety concern, members will be required to change

4-H Approved Dress Code: Professional and/or business casual attire. Must have sleeved shirts (NO T-shirts), which must be long enough to cover a midriff, and not be low cut; a blazer may be worn; jeans, slacks or dress pants (NO Holes); closed-toed footwear (for safety purposes NO tennis shoes or sandals. Boots are preferred. Caps or ball caps are not to be worn in the show/sale ring.


Horse Requirements: Western attire is required, including hats, helmets, and dark colored boots. No colored boots are allowed. Spurs and chaps are optional.

Cat and Dog Requirements: Appropriate attire to compliment the animal. Cat Showman must wear Long-Sleeved shirts.

Dairy Cattle & Goat Requirements: Long sleeved white shirt, white pants and brown or black leather shoes (no leather tennis shoes). For safety purposes, boots are preferred.

Interview Judging: Appropriate business casual attire for example: a long or short sleeve button-up collar shirt or polo, pants, footwear with closed toe shoes.

VISUAL ARTS and PHOTOGRAPHY

Hanging Exhibits: Posters, pictures, artwork and photography exhibits should come with a method for hanging. They will be displayed on hooks that will be hung on peg boards. If the item cannot be hung, they will be displayed on the floor or table. Display Boards and posters must be able to stand on their "own" on a table or floor. The Campbell County Fair Board is not responsible for breakage due to inadequate display method.

No breakable glass allowed/use of plexiglass or shrink wrap is allowed. Failure to exhibit items in an appropriate manner will be disqualified. Example: must follow the 4-H Photography & Visual Arts display guidelines brochure found at the Extension Office or https://tinyurl.com/duhs5j5x.

Display Materials: 1. Foam Board - Mounted securely on a stiff foam board. 2. Matting - Picture mounted securely to frame and board on back. 3. Frame - Not suggested. If you choose to use a frame, light weight is preferred.

Hanging Options: 1. Punched Holes - Hanging hole at top center. It should be 1/2" down from the board's top and about 1/2" in diameter. 2. Wire or String - Firmly attached to the top two corners with wire strung from one side to the other. Do Not tape to the corners. 3. Hook - Small Wire command hooks at top center. DO NOT USE: Weak string, yarn, pipe cleaners, pop top tabs, coat hangers or tape!

Every Fabric and Fashion item must have an identification label SEWN into the garment. Labels are available at the Extension Office. Do not pin the labels in the garment.

All garments considered for wool awards must be labeled "Wool" by a tag sewn into the garment.

REMINDER **Warning System at Fair **

EXHIBIT/LIVESTOCK AREAS: The Campbell County Fair Board will utilize the Warning system in Exhibit/Livestock areas. The Warning system will work as follows for not following animal care rules (feeding/watering/tie in and tie out times) or exhibiting cleanliness.

The warning system will consist of a three-step process. Superintendents are deemed authority given by the Campbell County Fair Board to issue warnings as follows:

Yellow Card: If there is a violation of proper animal husbandry ethics, a yellow card will be attached to the stall/cage/exhibit area. The yellow card means attention needs to be given to either feed and water, or cleanliness of stall/cage, alley or tack areas.

Orange Card: If a second warning is to be given for not taking care of the issue or found in violation a second warning, Orange Card, will be attached to the stall/cage/exhibit area.

Red Card: When a Red Card is deemed necessary, a Campbell County Fair Board member and the Department Superintendent will ask the exhibitor to remove their animal(s)/exhibit from the grounds. Receiving a Red Card will result in forfeiture of premiums and Youth Livestock Sale privileges.

Sheep and Goats

Scrapies Tag: All exhibition sheep and goats must be tagged with a USDA/APHIS scrapies tag/ID. Those without scrapies identification will not be allowed on the Fairgrounds

Weigh Ins: All lambs must have been totally slick shorn within 5 days of weigh in.

Market goats must be uniformly slick shorn with 3/8 inch of hair or less at the time of weigh-in. Legs may have hair up to the hock and knee only.

Drenching Rule

Oral drenching using drench guns is allowed. The use of stomach pumps, drench tubes, or any other esophageal method is prohibited.
