
The Clover Blast



YOUR PURPOSE:

To help youth develop life skills and help youth learn skills and information about a specific project.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- ·Plan and prepare for project meetings or workshops. This could include workshops, field trips, audio/video resources, guest speakers, teaching kits, or etc ·Use and promote project curriculum.
- ·Be familiar with 4-H rules, policies, guidelines, and deadlines.
- Inform members of and encourage participation in other 4-H opportunities related to the project, such as Showcase Showdown, county workshops, county fair, state fair, and awards related to the project area.

Specific Leaders

- Dog Skill- A-Thon Coach: DSAT is a contest at Showcase Showdown in June. Members compete in Breed ID, Parts of a Dog, Quiz Bowl and Skill-A-Thon.
- Royalty Leader: This is almost an all year program where youth work on philanthropy and giving to the community. They present flags at events and attend the Cheyenne Frontier Days with other royalty.
- Livestock Judging Coach: Coaching can be year around or seasonal. Members learn to evaluate the four main species. Competitions happen throughout the year, but mainly in the summer with the State Contest at Wyoming State Fair.

** You must be enrolled and have dues paid in 4-H and/or FFA **

<u>ATTENTION</u> - All 4-H and FFA members who will be showing a market animal at the Campbell County Fair and are intending to sell that animal at the Youth Livestock Sale must attend!!! There will be a 15% commission charge on all animals selling at the Youth Livestock Sale. However, a youth can have their commission reduced to 5% by completing the following items 1-3:

- 1. Attend one of the YLS Mandatory Informational Meetings (dates, times, & locations are below).
 - a. At the Mandatory Meeting, fill out a W-9 for tax purposes You must bring your social security number with you to the meeting. It is highly recommended that all youth, but especially First- & Second-year livestock members (regardless of age), attend with a parent or guardian.
 - At the Mandatory Meeting, one business will be assigned to you. Personally, visit your business inviting them to the Campbell County Fair and Youth Livestock Sale.
 - A business information form will be provided to obtain their signature, and they must be returned to the <u>Fair Office</u> by the County Fair Entry Deadline on Monday, July 7th, 2025, by 12:00am (midnight) **

- 2. The day of the sale you Must attend the mandatory set-up meeting, help clean, and setup for the sale.
- 3. Pick up your Buyer's thank-you gift at the Fair Office and deliver it to your buyer. A postcard is provided with their gift to obtain the buyer's signature. The postcard <u>Must</u> be delivered and/or mailed back to the Fair Office by November 1st, 2025.

<u>Reminder:</u> New in 2025, the Sheep, Swine, & Goat tags won't be handed out at the mandatory meetings. Multiple in-person taggings will be scheduled for the last week of May. The specific tagging locations, dates, and times are to be determined. When finalized the updated details will be in the 4-H Flash Newsletter, Remind, and shared with the FFA Advisors.

Goat Horns ~ policy update = In 2025, the Wyoming State Fair (WSF) will be implementing the following horn rules to be able to show at the WSF. Please contact the WSF Goat Superintendent if you have further questions. WSF Office 307-358-2398.

- 1. Market Goats: No horns allowed; scurs no longer than 1 inch are acceptable.
- 2. Breeding Meat Goats: horns are allowed.
- 3. Dairy Goats: No horns allowed in purebred classes.

Campbell County Fair will be adopting the same guidelines, with exceptions to aged Dairy Breeding Does that have been previously allowed to show at the County Fair. Please contact the Market/Breeding Goat Superintendent (Garrett) or Dairy Goat Superintendent (Shellie) if you have further questions. Fair Office 307-687-0200.
