




Campbell County 4-H has paid summer internships. Internship positions are designed for those who are 18 or older and are seeking experience in the 4-H office setting.





Poultry Project Information



POULTRY PROJECT INFORMATION

For those 4-H families that are taking poultry projects this year, you will need to consider your goals and the type of poultry you would like to show. The timing of purchasing your birds is especially important and may have an influence on their placing at fair. It takes approximately 6 months for pullets to start laying and if this is your goal, you may want to purchase your pullets by March or early April. If you are taking a poultry meat pen, it is especially important to be diligent and research your breeds and how long it will take for a finished weight by fair. Fryer meat birds, such as Buff Orpingtons, Jersey Giants, Rangers or similar dual-purpose cockerels, will require purchasing months earlier than the big broiler breeds, such as the Cornish varieties.

Large bird meat pens, such as a, turkey, duck, or goose, take months to reach their finish weight so it is essential to research the different breeds of each species as to their mature weight. All other dual purpose and ornamental birds do not have a strict purchase date, however the more mature, birds may have a higher placing. There are also classes for your birds over a year old. These birds will have their own individual classes to enter.

POULTRY RULE INFORMATION

- 1. Limited to 25 poultry entries and must be owned by June 1 of the current year per
- 2.Only two entries per breed, per exhibitor.
- 3. Only one meat pen may be exhibited and must be under a year old. If sold at the livestock sale, the exhibitor is responsible for processing the meat pen for the buyer.
- 4.Exhibitors must attend the mandatory livestock sale meetings and sign the sale information sheet by the end of the poultry show, to be eligible to sell their meat pen at the livestock sale.
- 5. Exhibitors with individual birds are required to bring them to the table to show. If younger members need help, there will be someone there to assist.
- 6.Large birds and trios will be judged in their cages.
- 7.If you wish to show in the showmanship class, you must enter at the time your birds are entered for fair.
- 8. Trios consist of one male and two females of the same breed that are uniform in color and size. (chickens only show in trios)
- 9. Laying pen consists of three females of the same breed that are uniform in color and size. They may be pullets or hens however; they may have a higher placing if they are
- 10. Pairs consist of one male and one female of the large birds only (ducks, geese, peafowl, turkeys and pigeons/doves) show in pairs or they may be shown as an individual
- 11. Meat pen clarification:
- a. One male or one female turkey.
- b.One male or female goose or one male or female duck
- c.Broilers, three male or three female, same breed uniform in size and color. (weight) d.Chickens, three cockerels that are the same breed and are uniform in size and color.
- 12. Eggs should also be uniform in size and color and should be clean.
- 13. Please refer to the rules in the fair book as this only clarifies a few.







Youth Livestock Sale (YLS) MANDATORY MEETING!!!





<u>ATTENTION</u> - All 4-H and FFA members who will be showing a market animal at the Campbell County Fair and are intending to sell that animal at the Youth Livestock Sale must attend!!! There will be a 15% commission charge on all animals selling at the Youth Livestock Sale. However, a youth can have their commission reduced to 5% by completing the following items 1-3:

- 1. Attend one of the YLS Mandatory Informational Meetings (dates, times, & locations are below).
 - a. At the Mandatory Meeting, fill out a W-9 for tax purposes You must bring your social security number with you to the meeting. It is highly recommended that all youth, but especially First-& Second-year livestock members (regardless of age), attend with a parent or guardian.
 - At the Mandatory Meeting, one business will be assigned to you. Personally, visit your business inviting them to the Campbell County Fair and Youth Livestock Sale.
 - A business information form will be provided to obtain their signature, and they must be returned to the <u>Fair Office</u> by the County Fair Entry Deadline on Monday, July 7th, 2025, by 12:00am (midnight) **

 by November 1st, 2025.

Goat News



Goat Horns ~ policy update = In 2025, the Wyoming State Fair (WSF) will be implementing the following horn rules to be able to show at the WSF. Please contact the WSF Goat Superintendent if you have further questions. WSF Office 307-358-2398.

- 1. Market Goats: No horns allowed; scurs no longer than 1 inch are acceptable.
- 2. Breeding Meat Goats: horns are allowed.
- 3. Dairy Goats: No horns allowed in purebred classes.

Campbell County Fair will be adopting the same guidelines, with exceptions to aged Dairy Breeding Does that have been previously allowed to show at the County Fair. Please contact the Market/Breeding Goat Superintendent (Garrett) or Dairy Goat Superintendent (Shellie) if you have further questions. Fair Office 307-687-0200.
