Hello Cloverbud families.



HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS!

Whether you live in the country or city; in a house, apartment, or mobile home; there are things to learn that will help make the space you live beautiful and functional. Interior Design is a great way to learn about design, color, texture, and space. It will help you make your home a fun and comfortable place to be.



WILDFLOWER ARRANGEMENT

Go for a walk with a parent. With approval of the home owner, cut flowers and greenery to make an arrangement. Think of the colors and elements in the room where the flowers will go. Supplies: natural flowers and greenery, scissors, vase or jar, water. When picking, cut flower types into odd numbers (1, 3, or 5). Either yourself or your parent should carry the bundle as you explore. Keep the vase at home, but remember how big it is wide so you get enough plants without getting too many. As you walk, arrange your plants so you know you are getting enough color and a variety of heights. When you get home, place your stems into the vase or jar one at a time, turning it as you go so you can see all angles of the arrangement. Once all the flowers are in place, fill with the greenery.




FURNITURE FIDGET SPINNER GAME



LET'S MOVE IT!

Grab a fidget spinner if you have one. Mark one arm as your arrow. Spin! When it lands on an item, search your home for that item! If you don't have a spinner, close your eyes and pick!




MAKE IT YOURS!

Supplies: Paper Pint Containers, Scissors, Yarn (variegated colors work best!)

1.Use scissors to cut the cup into a total of 9 spokes. To keep the spokes evenly spaced, start by cutting the cup into thirds, and then cut each piece into three pieces. 2.Next, tie the end of a ball of yarn to one of the spokes. Tuck the end with the knot into the cup. 3.Weave the yarn in and out of the spokes. After a few rounds of weaving, gently push the yarn to the bottom of the cup to keep the weaving tight. Weaving can take a bit of time, so go slowly and be patient! 4.Once the yarn is woven to the top of the cup, tie another knot to secure the weaving in place. Carefully tuck the end of the yarn into the cup. 5.Fill the woven pencil cup with pens, scissors, markers, and pencils!
