Community involvement is at the heart of the 4-H experience. Beyond learning practical skills and exploring new sparks, 4-H empowers young people to become active citizens who understand the importance of giving back. Through hands-on projects, service opportunities, and leadership development, youth in 4-H discover that they more than just kids in their communities.

One of the most valuable lessons 4-H teaches is the impact of service. Whether it's participating food drives, picking up trash, writing cards for seniors, or volunteering at community events, youth learn that even small acts of kindness can create meaningful change. These experiences help young people develop empathy, responsibility, and a deeper understanding of the needs around them. Instead of being told why service matters, they see it firsthand and carry those lessons with them for life.

By teaching youth to give back and be involved, 4-H helps shape compassionate leaders who are invested in the well-being of others. These are the young people who will continue to step up, serve, and lead, ensuring that their communities thrive for generations to come.

In 4-H, community involvement isn't just an activity, it's a way of life. And through it, youth learn one of the most important lessons of all: that they have the power to make a difference.

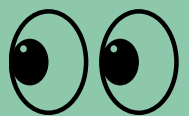

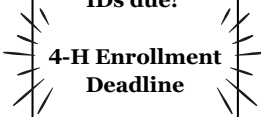

POULTRY RULE INFORMATION

- Each exhibitor is limited to 25 poultry entries and must be owned by June 1.
- Only two entries per breed, per exhibitor.
- Only **one meat pen** may be exhibited and must be under a year old. If sold at the livestock sale, the exhibitor is responsible for processing the meat pen for the buyer.
- Exhibitors must attend the mandatory livestock sale meetings and sign the sale information sheet *by the end of the poultry show*.
- Exhibitors with individual birds are required to bring them to the table to show. *Assistance will be available for younger members.*
- Large birds and trios will be judged in their cages.
- To show in the showmanship class, you must enter when birds are entered.
- Trios:** One male and two females of the same breed (*chickens only*).
- Laying Pen:** Three females of the same breed, pullets or hens.
- Pairs:** One male and one female of the large birds (*ducks, geese, turkeys, pigeons, etc.*).
- Meat Pens Must Be Uniform in Weight:**
 - Two male or two female turkeys. Toms: 22-44 lbs. Hens: 16-33 lbs.
 - Two male or two female geese. 8-22 lbs.
 - Two male or two female ducks. 5-16 lbs.
 - Broiler chickens. 3 males or 3 females. 5-10 lbs.
 - Fryer chickens. 3 cockerels. 5-10 lbs.
- Eggs should be uniform in size and color, and clean.

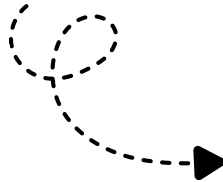

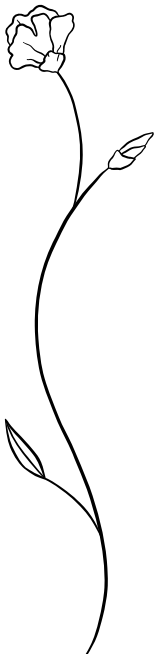

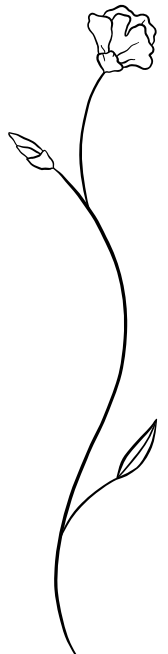
