Thank You, to all the 4-H Parents and Volunteer leaders for all your time and effort in helping our youth "learn by doing" in our 4-H program! You are Wonderful!!

Congratulations to all 4-H members who competed in County and State contests this summer! Whether you were able to accomplish your goals or not, be sure to recognize what you learned along the way. Don't worry if you didn't reach your goal this year - sometimes it takes more than one try to reach a goal. Keep your chin up, continue to move forward and trust that every experience is teaching you something you can use in the future. I hope you feel proud of all the time and effort you put into learning life skills, project skills, social skills, Leadership skills, etc.. You are amazing!

September is an exciting time we are ending a 4-H year and beginning a new one. The current 4-H year ends on September 30th, 2017. To finish this 4-H year remember to document all your accomplishments in your 4-H portfolio (record book). Youth who do 4-H Portfolio's learn to develop skills in observation, data collection, organization, critical thinking, planning and time management, record keeping, and communication skills. Please plan ahead to make sure your 4-H Portfolio gets to the Carbon County Extension office by 5 pm on Sept. 15, 2017.

Attention Adults: I am looking for some parents or volunteer leaders to help with 4-H portfolio judging. It can be very helpful to read through a bunch of these Portfolios – you will be amazed at what our youth have accomplished. It will also help you to know more about what needs to be included in a 4-H Portfolio so you can take that knowledge and share it with your club for the coming year. I would love to have at least one adult per club attend a day or evening of judging. I would be happy to provide a meal for your effort! Please contact me if you are willing to help.

The Wyoming State Fair does not have the State Fair results available online yet (this would include all the youth animal shows). I was told it might be a month before they are available.

October 1st is the beginning of the new 2017-2018 4-H Year. Please remember all current 4-H Members and Volunteer Leaders need to re- enroll in 4-H Online on or after October 1st. There will be a \$10 registration fee assessed per youth beginning this 4-H year. More information will be sent out soon regarding the payment procedure. The registration fee will cover the State 4-H insurance fees and will provide funds for 4-H programming for the coming 4-H year. There will be scholarships available for those in need. I will be contacting 4-H Volunteers about scheduling some time to discuss the new State 4-H Policies, By-laws, Chartering process, etc..

*2017 will be the 75th year of "National 4-H Week" – It is always held the first full week of October, so this year it will be October 1-7, 2017. 





Youth Volunteer Service Recognition- Prudential Spirit of Community Award

Students in grades 5-12 who have volunteered in the past year are eligible for honors at the local, state and national level. Top honorees earn monetary awards and all-expense-paid trips with a parent or guardian to Washington, D.C. for special recognition events.

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards – the largest youth recognition program in the U.S. based exclusively on volunteer service – is sponsored by Prudential Financial in partnership with the National Association of Secondary School Principals. A number of 4-H members have earned state -level recognition from the program in recent years.

Here's how your chapter can participate:

Now through **November 7**, **2017**, youth volunteers can apply at http://spirit.prudential.com and www.nassp.org/spirit.

- Members must complete their applications and submit certification materials to your executive officer by **November 7.**
- Then, your chapter can select one Local Honoree for every 1,000 members (or portion thereof) in grades 5-8, and one for every 1,000 members (or portion thereof) in grades 9-12.
- Once Local Honorees have been selected, executive officers have until November 17, 2017 to certify their applications online for state-level judging.

All state-level honorees will receive special recognition, and top youth volunteers are eligible for monetary awards and all-expense-paid trips to Washington, D.C. for several days of special recognition events.

Portfolio Information!

Hello 4-H Members, Families, & Leaders,

It has been a wonderful 4-H Year and now it is time to put all that you learned and accomplished down on paper. Yes, it is time to finish up your 4-H Portfolio (Record Book).

Your 4-H Portfolio is due to the Carbon County Extension office by 5 pm on September 15, 2017. If you are mailing, please make sure you mail it in time for us to receive it in the office by September 15th. 4-H Portfolio's received late will not be eligible for 4-H Portfolio scholarships for the current year.

Completing and submitting a 4-H Portfolio is highly recommended as it is a vital part of the 4-H "Learn, Do, Reflect, Apply" process. You learned throughout the year, you did a project, and now it's time to wrap up the learning process by reflecting and applying what you have learned.

Your 4-H Portfolio is a way to reflect on what you learned this year and to share your experiences with others. What goals did you set for yourself? What steps did you take during the year to work toward those goals? What did you learn about yourself? about your project? about others? about topics you didn't know you would learn about? What did you enjoy most? What would you do differently next time? How can you apply what you learned to other areas or projects in your life?

**Please note EVERYONE NEEDS TO BE USING THE CURRENT 4-H PORTFOLIO PAGES found online at http://www.uwyo.edu/4-h/portfolio/index.html

This website does contain helpful instructions for accessing, type & save, and downloading the portfolio pages. There is an instructional video as well. Please contact the Carbon County Extension office, 328-2642, if you have any questions or need help accessing the Portfolio pages.

You can type directly into the portfolio pages and print or you can print the pages and handwrite your information. Either way, You will need to submit a printed copy of your Portfolio not an electronic copy. Please secure your printed Portfolio pages either in a 4-H Portfolio binder (which our office has for sale for \$3 each) or in a three ring binder.

Hints, tips and reminders:

- Leave all your past information in your binder. Preferably you should have your information separated by sections with the newest page on top of last year's page, in each section. The Judge will be looking at past and current pages for evidence of your growth throughout the years of your participation.
- It is highly preferred and very helpful to have tabs labeling each section. The judges will be looking for you to have entered something in each section of your Portfolio
- The cover page and sections 1, 6, & 7 will require new pages to be added every year. Example: place this year's new section 1 page on top of last year's section 1 and this year's new section 6 on top of last year's section 6...
- Section 1 requires you to have a separate page for each 4-H project you are enrolled in. Example: if you are enrolled in Woodworking and Shotgun you will need two section 1 goal setting pages.

- ** Please notice Section 1 and section 6 each have different forms for Juniors, while the Intermediates and Seniors will use the same forms.
 - ⇒ Please be careful to use the correct form for your 4-H age level.

 You are a Junior if you were age 8 10 on January 1, 2017. You are an Intermediate if you were age 11- 13 as of January 1, 2017. You are a Senior if you were age 14 18 as of January 1, 2017.
- Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 8 don't require a new page every year just add the new date and info to the same page from year to year until you run out of room, then add a new page on top of the old.
- Some people have organized their books by year instead of section # this is not preferred but is
 acceptable, as long as it is labeled and easy to figure out. The drawback is that you will print new
 pages for all sections every year which really isn't necessary.
- Please DON'T include your county & state fair ribbons. The 4-H Portfolio is meant to be a learning tool - goal setting, what you did to reach the goal, how it all turned out, what you learned in the process, how can you apply what you learned to other things in your lives. It is supposed to help you learn how to document, keep records and report findings - to help you think about how to apply what you learned - even if it is just to plan for the next 4-H project you want to do.
 - ⇒ Although it is tempting and similar in concept, the 4-H Portfolio is not meant to be a "scrapbook" so just remember to keep all the content, but don't go full blown into a scrapbook- keep the frills to a minimum.
- Carbon County 4-H uses the "Score Sheet" found on the 4-H Portfolio website to judge portfolios. We do not use the "Weighted Score Sheet".
 - ⇒ **Please don't include the score sheet when you submit your portfolio.
 - ⇒ Feel free to use the score sheet as a guide when preparing your portfolio, to make sure you are including all that will be looked for when it is being judged.
- Section 3: 4-H Leadership, seems to give people some difficulty. Be creative Leadership can be more than holding an officer position such as President, in your club. If you volunteered to be in charge of planning something for your club, or looking up information for the club, or if you helped new members by calling them to remind them about deadlines, etc.. these things count as leadership. Leadership activities for a 16 year old should be a bit more complex, or detailed, or more in quantity listed than an 8 year old would have. Example: Leading the 4-H pledge could count as Leadership for a Junior age 8-10
- Be sure to list your Educational Opportunities in your Portfolio in section 5. If you don't think it fits in section 5 list it in section 8 or contact Cathy at the Carbon County Extension office to find out where to list it.
- If you aren't sure where to put something in the portfolio please call 328-2642 or email ccraig@uwyo.edu Cathy Craig at the Carbon County Extension office if you are working on this during a time when you can't reach Cathy put the information in the section you think it best fits. It will be better to put it somewhere than to not list it at all.

The 4-H Portfolio is a learning tool for youth; but is also used as part of the application process for some of the State & National 4-H Trips, State 4-H Leadership Team, State 4-H Shooting Sports Raton Trip, and some 4-H college scholarships. You might be surprised that it will even help when completing other college scholarship applications because you will have so many of your accomplishments and involvements documented in this one place.

Wyoming 4-H Member Achievement Program

The achievement program is designed to recognize youth members' continued involvement in the Wyoming 4-H Program. Youth between the ages of 8 and 18 can receive annual recognition based on their efforts. The annual recognition categories are listed below:

Green Membership Recognition = 0 points

- Member has turned in all required enrollment materials
- Member has behaved in an appropriate manner at all 4-H activities, events, and meetings
- Member is enrolled in at least one project
- Member is enrolled in at least one club or has approval of County 4-H Educator

<u>Silver Recognition = 1 point</u>

- Member meets Membership Recognition criteria outlined above
- Member has exhibited what he/she has learned at some point in the current 4-H year
- Member provides documentation (usually using a 4-H Portfolio) of setting goals, knowledge/skills gained, and participation in project, participation in 1 Educational Opportunity, Participation in 1 Community Service.

Gold Recognition = 3 points

- Member meets Membership Recognition criteria outlined above
- Member has <u>exhibited</u> what he/she learned at some point in the current 4-H year
- Member provides documentation with a <u>complete 4-H Portfolio</u>, showing participation in all essential elements of positive youth development: setting goals, knowledge/skills gained, recognition, leadership, 1 community service, and participation in project and 1 Educational Opportunity (Most likely via the portfolio.)

Honors Club

The ultimate achievement a 4-H member can obtain is induction into the Wyoming 4-H Honors Club achieved by receiving nineteen (19) points over the course of the member's involvement. A member receives three (3) points for each year in which Gold Recognition is achieved and one (1) point for each year Silver Recognition is achieved. Points are evaluated and recorded through the local County 4-H Program. Once a member achieves 19 or more points they will receive a certificate and a pendant/pin recognizing them as members of the Wyoming 4-H Honors Club. This recognition can be listed on college applications, scholarships, etc. to show the youth's commitment and drive.

Get Ready For 4-H Rollover to 2017-2018 Year!

Before rollover:

the completion date - September 15th 2017.

*Have you let your club leaders know of any Ed. Ops, or Community Services, so they can report to the 4-H Educator for achievement recognition?

*Reminder to send thank you to your donor if you received any awards!

After rollover:

*ENROLL FOR THE 2017-2018 4-H YEAR! - You have to enroll in 4-H every year, remember if you have enrolled before use your previous years profile to re-enroll. Otherwise you will have to re-do your enrollment.

*If you are a first year please contact your club leader to make sure you are meeting/executing your 4-H responsibilities correctly. (if this is not your first year but you would still like to check in, feel free to do so.)


