



4-H Values



Dear 4-H Friends & Families.....

Sportsmanship is developed at a young age through life expectancies and positive reinforcement from parents and other caring adults in their life. It's getting close to our county fair and that means youth will be competing with their 4-H projects. Let's review some sportsmanship guidelines so all youth and adults have positive experiences this summer:

4-H Sportsmanship is defined as:

- **Displaying respect for animals:** This means exercising good animal management through proper healthcare and nutrition, as well as fair training practices. Animals deserve humane treatment in July exchange for what they provide.
- **Displaying respect for opponents:** Sportsmanlike competitors recognize and appreciate a well-prepared, challenging opponent who can bring out the best in them and share that appreciate with their opponents.
- **Displaying respect for the "game":** This includes respecting and following the rules of the event. It also includes always trying one's best, using skill and training to achieve positive results and appreciating the process.
- **Displaying respect for others:** Judges, show managers, parents, superintendents, CWF fair staff, and 4-H Extension/FFA staff, and leaders deserve respect as well. If you are feeling frustrated, it is important to find an appropriate location and time to vent.

Some other things to keep in mind:

- Actively praise and congratulate others: Everyone likes to be congratulated for a job well done! For adults and youth to genuinely and actively recognize other youth for their accomplishments, even if it is just "great job out there" or "I love watching you show," it becomes a natural part of the show.
- **Show Compassion:** Even the most successful showman has disappointments and setbacks during their showing careers. All too often we gravitate toward the negative, but reality is that people who are successful have countless hours of hard work and a large emotional investment into their projects. Parents can model good sportsmanship by extending a kind word to others when they are struggling. This creates an environment where people feel cared for, supported and connected. *Always Be Kind.*



- Don't criticize others. The old adage "if you don't have anything nice to say, don't say anything at all" can go a long way. We all have opinions; however, it is up to us how to word those opinions so they don't hurt or disparage anyone else. We may not agree with the judge's placing that day or perhaps we would have managed the show differently, but we must show respect to those people because, after all, they're all people. The beauty of life is that we don't all think and operate the same way. Finding the value in another person's critique of our performance, learning about different ways to manage shows and observing others free from judgment allows us to learn a great deal.
- Take care in being your child's biggest fan and greatest analyzer: Finding balance between when to sing your child's praises and when to give them advice on their performance is key. When parents continue singing their child's praises, the child may feel an enormous amount of pressure to not let their parents down. On the flipside, when a youth is constantly and ruthlessly analyzed as to what they could or should have done, the child may begin to feel inadequate and unworthy of praise. Striking the balance between the two is hard; a simple approach is to turn to your child. Ask them how they think they performed. If they were happy, encourage them and enjoy that moment. If they felt they could have improved, offer good support to help them meet their goal.

At any given time, county fair can be exciting, stressful, emotional and exhausting for all involved. With all of the buzzing around and competition, the environment is ripe with opportunity to lead by example! Let's all do our part to encourage good sportsmanship and be the catalyst to help make *our* county fair be the incredible experience that it's meant to be.
