## **4-H Guidelines**



#### **Educational Opportunities (Ed. Ops.)**

#### What counts as an educational opportunity?

- An Ed. Op. is anything outside your project area or something beyond what you would normally learn in your project manual/area.
- Ed. Op.'s can NOT be taught by or to immediate family unless 3 or more 4-H members are present and at least one of them is a non-family member.

#### How many are recommended?

 1 Ed. Op. is recommended each 4-H year, however members are encouraged to participate in as many as they would like.

Who do you report them to?

 Members keep track of the Educational Opportunities they participated in through their Record Book/Portfolio.

#### Community Service

#### What counts as Community Service?

 Anything done to help another person or community (Family Excluded) without individual compensation.

#### How many are recommended?

 1 Community Service is recommended each 4-H year, however members are encouraged to participate in as many as they would like.

#### Who do you report them to?

 Member keep track of the Community Service they have participated in through their Record Book/Portfolio.

#### **4-H Member Guidelines**



#### All 4-H Members Are <u>Required</u> To:

- Enroll in at least one club and one project
- Follow the Wyoming 4-H Code of Conduct
- Pay the \$15 enrollment fee

#### All 4-H Members Are Encouraged To:

- Attend all club & project meetings
- Participate in at least 1 Educational
  Opportunity each 4-H year (you do not have to do one per project)
- Participate in at least 1 act of
  Community Service each 4-H year
- Exhibit a project each 4-H year (whether at County Fair or elsewhere)
- Submit a 4-H Record Book/Portfolio each 4-H year

#### <u>Exhibit</u>

- What counts as an Exhibit?
  - Any time a member exhibits and /or presents a project in front of 3 or more, non-family members
- How many are recommended?
- 1 Exhibit is recommended each 4-H year, however members are encouraged to participate in as many as they would like
   Who do you report them to?
  - Members keep track of their exhibited projects through their Record Book/Portfolio

#### 4-H Project Add/Drop Deadline: June 1

In order to exhibit a 4-H project at the Carbon County Fair you must be <u>enrolled</u> in that project (through 4HOnline) by <u>June 1</u>.

If you enroll in that project after June 1, you will not be allowed to exhibit that project in the 4-H shows at Carbon County Fair. (However, you could still enter the Open Class shows.)

\*Please note: 4-H Enrollment is NOT the same as a Fair Entry form. You will also need to submit a fair entry form on FairEntry.com to enter your project in county fair. The deadline is different every year.



#### 4-H Record Book/Portfolio

#### What is a 4-H Record Book/Portfolio?

- A record kept by the 4-H member about their 4-H year
- Members are required to use the Wyoming 4-H Portfolio / Record Book which is available at the Carbon County Extension Office or online at: <u>http://www.uwyo.edu/4-h/portfolio/index.html</u>

#### Why do a 4-H Record Book/Portfolio?

- The 4-H Portfolio is meant to help youth learn how to set goals, record experiences and describe successes & involvement. The intent is that they will reflect about what they learned and apply this knowledge in the future.
- These skills can be applied throughout their entire lives. Most jobs require some type of record keeping, reporting, evaluation & planning for the next project. 4-H youth will already have practice and confidence in their ability to do these tasks.
- The 4-H Portfolio provides a handy place to keep track of information they will find necessary to have when applying for college scholarships and even jobs.
- The State 4-H office & 4-H Foundation use portfolios as part of the application process for scholarships and for youth who want to participate in State or National 4-H groups & events. The portfolio will also help when completing non-4-H Scholarships as they require a lot of the same information.

#### Record Book/Portfolio Awards

- Generous donors allow us to offer cash awards for the top three portfolios in each 4-H age group county-wide
- Jr: 1st-\$25, 2nd-\$20, 3rd-\$15
- Int: 1st-\$50, 2nd-\$40, 3rd-\$30
- Sr: 1st-\$100, 2nd-\$75, 3rd-\$50

#### When is your 4-H Record Book/Portfolio due?

Record Books/Portfolios must be turned in to the Carbon County Extension office or postmarked and in the mail by:

September 15





## State 4-H Achievement Program

Gold Achievement—3 points Member meets silver requirements AND Submits an Exceptionally Complete 4-H Record Book/

#### Silver Achievement—1 point

- Member meets green requirements AND 3/4 of the below:
- Participates in at least one Educational Opportunity
  Participates in at least one Community Service project
- Participates in at least one Community Service project Exhibits at least one of their 4-H projects
- Completes and turns in a Record Book/Portfolio

#### Green Achievement—0 points (participation)

Member is enrolled and has been accepted as an active member by the Carbon County 4-H Educator Member is in good standing and follows the Wyoming 4-H Code

of Conduct

#### Wyoming State 4-H Honors Club: 19 accumulated points

The ultimate achievement that a 4-H member can obtain is inclusion in the Wyoming 4-H Honors Club. It is based on the principle of recognition for youth that maximize their opportunities to foster the elements positive youth development of belonging, independence, generosity, and master over multiple years of engagement. Nineteen (19) points must be accumulated from annual recognition points earned. Honor's club inductees are given special recognition that includes an exclusive UW Cowboy Clover tie/lapel pin or necklace/bracelet charm.


## **Community Service Opps**
