Do Robert's Rules Really Create Order - February 24, 2020

Most 4-H Clubs use the traditional method of Robert's Rules of Order to conduct business meetings. Robert's Rules of Order can often be confusing and are not used properly in many 4-H clubs. Join this workshop to find out more about how to best modify the decision making process in your 4-H club to help members understand the process of what they are doing and why they are doing it. This workshop will look at alternative decision making methods including how to use a simplified version of Robert's Rules of Order.

Retain Your Membership—March 23, 2020

The Wyoming 4-H program has been part of multi-state retention study for the past four years. Our highest loss of members are first and second year members. Join us for this workshop to find out what the data from the study says. We will discuss why member leave and what we can do as volunteers to keep members coming back and engaging in the 4-H program. Record Books and Recognition—April 27, 2020

NILE (Foundation Int'l Livestock Exposition) **Freshman Scholarship – Due March 1, 2020 @ 5pm**

- Must have participation in NILE activities, and be currently enrolled in a 4-H or FFA program.
- Minimum GPA 2.5 or equivalent.
- Must be graduating high school senior planning to attend a 2 or 4-year College, university or vocational school in the year 2019-2020.
- Be continually enrolled as a full-time student at their school of choice.

Wyoming Weed & Pest Council – **Due March 23rd, 2020**

- Wyoming Resident
- Graduating High School or enrolled in college

Carbon County 4-H Foundation Scholarship – **Due April 1st, 2020**

- Past or present 4-H member.
- Attending any in or out of state accredited educational institution of higher learning on a full time basis.
- Application available at the [Carbon County Extension Office](#), paper or email.

Carbon County 4-H Foundation- Stallion Service Auction Scholarship – Due April 1st, 2020

- Any senior 4-H member (age 14-18 as of Jan 1st of current year) enrolled in Carbon County school who is or has been enrolled in the Carbon County horse program is eligible.
- This scholarship is to any college, university or trade school of the recipient's choice.
- Application is available at the Carbon County Extension Office, paper or email.

Carbon County Stock Grower's Association Scholarship – Due April 1st, 2020

- All applicants must have graduated (or equivalent) from a Carbon County high school.
- All applicants must attend a school of higher learning in Wyoming or bordering state.
- Open to: A) Any student enrolled in a field of agriculture - and/or
B) Immediate relatives of paid Carbon County Stock Grower members (to include sons, daughters, and grandchildren) wishing to study any field.

Carbon County Farm Bureau Scholarship #1– Due April 15th, 2020

- Must be graduating from a Carbon County high school.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA, based on a 4.0 system.
- Attend a Wyoming College/University in the upcoming fall semester.
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Farm Bureau “Member” Scholarship #2 – Due March 2nd, 2020

- Provide parent's Carbon County Farm Bureau Membership Number
- Be a graduating senior from high school
- Have at least a 3.00 cumulative grade point average, based on a 4.00 system. (Principal must sign to verify cumulative GPA)
- Attend an accredited college, university, or trade school
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.
- Application is available at <https://www.wyfb.org/education/scholarship/>

Carbon County Commissioners Scholarships: - Due Last Friday in April (24th), 2020

- Available to Students who plan on attending the University of Wyoming or any Wyoming Community College.
- Is not specific to graduating high school students. Non-traditional students are eligible.
- Must be a resident of Carbon County
- There will be 3 new scholarships and 1 renewal scholarship awarded each year.

Wyoming Association of Fairs Scholarship – Due May 1st, 2020

- Current or Alumni Wyoming 4-H or FFA member.
- Must be a 2018-2019 College Sophomore, Junior or Senior attending any Wyoming accredited institute of higher learning.

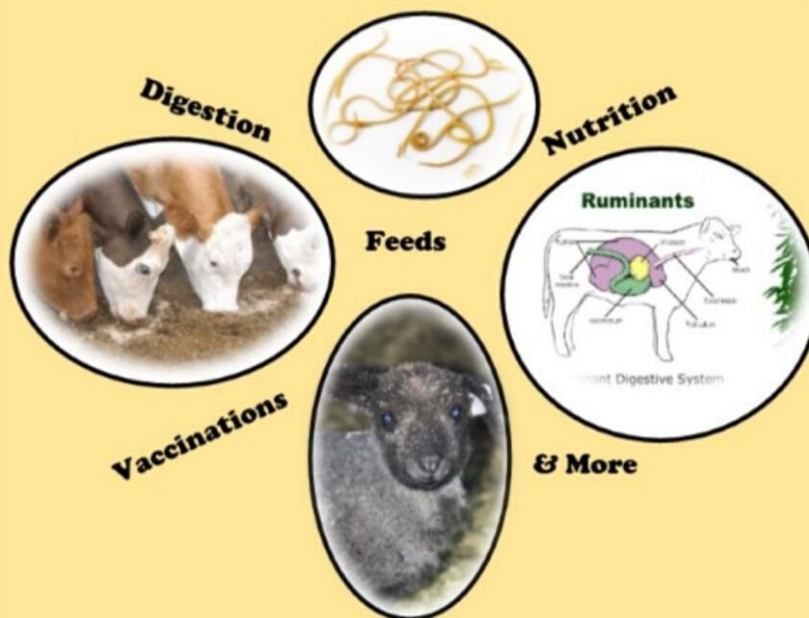

Allowing more Hogs

- More Market Hogs Allowed
 - 3 Market Hogs / 1 Breeding Hog
 - 3 Breeding Hogs / 1 Market Hog
 - 2 Breeding Hogs / 2 Market Hogs
- These changes will allow Carbon County to be more competitive at a local and state level.
- These changes will allow the Carbon County Gilt and Barrow show to be both competitive and fun for exhibitors.

Separating show by sex.

- Gilt show will be first on odd years.
- Barrow show will be first on even years.
- Class winners in both Gilt and Barrow show will return for final drive in their respective Gilt and Barrow shows.
- This will allow for more hogs in a final drive.
- Better separation for families with multiple kids showing hogs.
- Carbon County swing show will be following and industry trend.
- More chances for all swine exhibitors to place and receive a ribbon.
- Grand and Reserve Allowing more Hogs Gilts and Barrows will return for overall final drive at end of show.
