Utilize Club Officers—January 27, 2020

Your 4-H officers are a great asset to your 4-H club. As a 4-H volunteer or parent it is important to understand the role of an officer team and how to give them the power to create engaging and fun club meetings. In this workshop find out more about the duties of each officer and how you can work with them to lead great meetings.

Do Robert's Rules Really Create Order - February 24, 2020

Most 4-H Clubs use the traditional method of Robert's Rules of Order to conduct business meetings. Robert's Rules of Order can often be confusing and are not used properly in many 4-H clubs. Join this workshop to find out more about how to best modify the decision making process in your 4-H club to help members understand the process of what they are doing and why they are doing it. This workshop will look at alternative decision making methods including how to use a simplified version of Robert's Rules of Order.

Retain Your Membership—March 23, 2020

The Wyoming 4-H program has been part of multi-state retention study for the past four years. Our highest loss of members are first and second year members. Join us for this workshop to find out what the data from the study says. We will discuss why member leave and what we can do as volunteers to keep members coming back and engaging in the 4-H program. Record Books and Recognition—April 27, 2020

We are using a new online Record Book for 2019-2020. During this workshop we will take a look at how the new online Record Book works and how to use it. We will also look at the National 4-H Recognition Model and how 4-H clubs and county programs can provide different types of recognition for all youth involved.

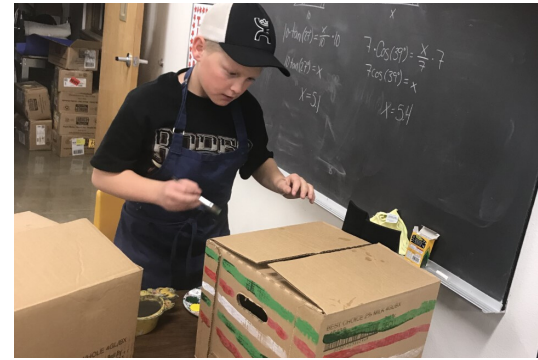

HOW TO SELL A FAIRBOOK AD!

1. Gather your ads, read over the information about ads, write your name and phone number as the seller.
 2. Take the sale sheet to the business. SMILE. Tell them these four things:
 - Introduce yourself - name & 4-H club
 - Why Are You There - To sell fairbook ads
 - Explain what fairbook ads are
 - Explain why we have a fairbook
 3. Give the ad page to the owner and explain the ad sizes and costs. "You had an ad last year and it was (size) 1/2 page. The cost was \$65 and was in color. We can do color or black and white."
 4. Let the business person think it over. So just smile.
 5. There are choices about making up their own ad, using a business card or going with last year's ad or not buying. Explain the process if they have questions.
 6. Payment: The business can pay by cash, check or be billed by the Fair Board
 7. Have the buyer approve the ad with a signature, collect their money, and THANK THEM.
 8. Take the ad, attach the money or check to the ad and return it and the other ads you sell to your leader.

EXPLORING 4-H AROUND THE WORLD



Exchange Program Overview

Come explore the world with us! You can experience the rich history and culture of **Finland**. The International 4-H Exchange Program is designed to advance cultural understanding, spark an interest in learning about other cultures, and develop a cadre of Americans who can advance international dialogue and live and work effectively in a global society.

Finland will be outbound trip only in the summer of 2020 with the Finns planning on visiting the US in 2021. The exchange trip will be approximately 2 weeks long.

Selection Criteria?

The program is open to current senior aged 4-H members (14-19) interested in traveling internationally, learning about different cultures, and living with a host family. Students will be selected on the following criteria:

- Personal leadership skills
- Social skills - Openness and flexibility
- Interest in learning about different cultures and global issues

Important Dates:

- Applications due January 15, 2020
 - Web video interviews – January 2020
 - Pre-trip orientation via web conference - TBD
 - Travel dates ~ Mid July 2020.
- Finland Tentative dates ~ July 17-19 Departure

How much does it cost?

The cost of the trip is **\$2,000 per person**. The following expenses will be included in the trip cost:

- Roundtrip airfare to host country
- Meals and lodging
- In country logistics (i.e. transportation, etc.)
- Travel insurance, Accident and sickness protection

A \$500 deposit will be required upon selection, the remaining balance can be made in monthly payments

There will be some additional expenses for participants which include:

- Passport & passport photos
- Immunization fees (if required)
- Transportation to and from US outbound/inbound airport
- Spending money for souvenirs and other in-country purchases
- In-country site seeing excursions
- Modest host family gift

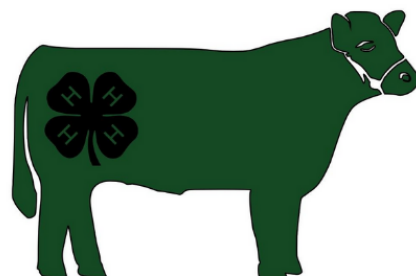
