Welcome to the 2020 Carbon County 4-H Archery season!

You will need to be registered for 4-H Archery before attending the first archery practice. Register at https://www.4honline.com/ *If you only plan to participate in 4-H Archery, please sign up for Rawlins Archery SPIN Club. This allows you to participate in archery only and does not require you to attend club meetings. It does limit your 4-H privileges.

*4-H Archery will start, Monday, April 6th at the Rec Center (after spring break). Practice will be from 6-7pm for Junior shooters and Intermediate/Senior shooters will practice from 7-8pm. We will need to stick to this schedule even on the first practice due to the amount of kids we have enrolled.

*Parents will need to attend the first practice to sign permission slips and pay Rec Center dues. Please come with a check, or cash to pay the Rec Center shooting range dues. The rec center usually works out a deal with us so that the shooters only have to pay $\frac{1}{2}$ the original cost. Please fill all paperwork out at the front desk of the Rec Center.

*Prior to April 6th - ALL shooters are required to schedule a time to meet with Cale to ensure their bow is ready for archery practice. Call or Text: Cale - 307-321-2643 to set up an appointment. You won't be able to participate if you haven't made an appointment prior to the first practice.

<u>Equipment:</u> If you are using 4-H equipment, we will get a bow setup for you when you schedule an appointment. For all shooters who already have their own bow, please schedule a time with us to make adjustments to draw length, and sights prior to the first practice. <u>Shooters are required to purchase their own arrows.</u> <u>Please have at least 8 arrows per shooter.</u>

<u>Practice Schedule:</u> Monday nights at the Rec Center starting April 6th.

- Junior shooters only from 6-7pm.
- Intermediate/Senior shooters only from 7-8pm.

I. Treasurer's Report

a.) Council Funds

i) Leaders Council Checking: \$23,620.07

ii) Leaders Council Savings: \$865.88 (Dormant)

a.) Funds held by Wyoming 4-H Foundation

i) Liability Account: \$13,540.58

ii) Endowment Account: \$28,167.05

II. Committees:

Horse: Linda Kraft updated everyone that the Horse Superintendents for County Fair have been changed and the horse show will now be all on one day

Shooting Sports: Emily reminded everyone of the shooting sports leader's state certifications coming up around the state and Mike said he will be attending the annual meeting of the State Shooting Sports Leaders Council to hear presentations on moving state shoot to Gillette, WY.

Livestock: Emily shared that the Fair Board has introduced new swine show rules for this year. Check Facebook, the Carbon County 4-H website or the Feb 4-H Newsletter for more info

III. Old Business

New Treasurer: Amy Berg is the new 2020 Carbon County 4-H Leader's Council treasurer.

IV. New Business

- a.) Leader's Council Budget: It was decided to not set a cap on the amount of money that should be spent to fund 4-H trips since so few members apply for funding every year
- b.) New Funding Request form: when applying for funding of a 4-H trip or project, a new form will be required. This form will be available on the Carbon County 4-H website and from club leaders.
- c.) Club Auditing on a 3 Year Rotation: According to the guidelines set forth by Wyoming 4-H, 4-H entities with a bank account should be audited by a committee every three years. Going forward, the Leader's Council will serve as the auditing committee. This will increase club treasurer accountability and be a good fiscally responsible move.
- d.) Judge Printed Record Books or Online: Starting this year (2019-2020 4-H year) Record Books are online at 4h.zsuite.org; 4-H members will have to record all information in their online account. Leader's Council voted to require 4-H members to print their completed record books and physically hand them in to be judged, just like in years past. This way past involvement information will still be included.
- e.) Livestock Sale Promotion Days: The Carbon County Fair Board would like the 4-H clubs to do some kind of promotion for the Junior Livestock Sale, whether it be writing letters, or getting together and visiting businesses. A good time would be June or July. A template for writing letters to potential buyers will be provided by the Extension Office to club leaders.
- f.) Emily will be out of the office on vacation with her family July 3-14. This is over State Shoot, so she will make preparations with Mike Moon to be the point of contact should any issues arise around registration.
