

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) from 4-H Volunteers regarding 4-H activities with COVID-19 parameters

Q: Why does UW 4-H have these parameters?

A: As a program of state government (UW), we support the guidance given by the governmental officials providing the parameters within which we operate. Guidance, orders, best practices, or other policies coming from the Governor, UW Administration, and state and county health officers are intended to provide safety for the general population.

Q: How is PPE being provided? (Sanitizer, wipes, face-masks, etc.)

A: UW Extension is working to provide limited support to clubs in terms of sanitizing resources and facemask. While limited in quantities, we are hopeful that county health officers will be able to provide additional safety materials and PPE as to each county as possible moving forward. Primary safety responsibility rests with the individual and supported by 4-H to reduce participation barriers.

Q: Where can our 4-H club/group meet? Are county facilities are open for meetings? [office, fairgrounds, library, etc.]

A: The availability for meeting space depends on each county's restrictions. Public facilities will have restrictions that vary. Meetings in private homes, churches, or other private facilities should still comply with UW 4-H safety best practices.

Q: What documents do I need to use for an attendance record of my meetings?

A: No specific form or document is required. Knowing who is all in attendance at each meeting on each specific date will be useful in a situation where COVID-19 is identified. The attendance information aids in tracking transmissions and potential spread.

Q: As a UW 4-H Volunteer, can I require the use of facemasks by others to participate in the meeting?

A: Yes. The health and safety of our volunteers is important to us. If you want to require the use of additional safety items like facemasks, you sure can. Just be sure to communicate that to the families and youth so they will know before they arrive or provide them for them. Maybe ask those in the 4-H sewing project to make you some masks. If someone refuses to comply after being asked to, you can ask them to leave the activity. Please be aware of others situations, feelings, and remember we want youth to want to participate in 4-H activities. This is would be a safety situation (yours and other attendees).

Q: Should I contact my county health officer for permission to do a 4-H activity?

A: No. Please direct questions to the UW Extension office. UW Extension (4-H) is in contact with our county health officers to keep updated information shared around all 4-H activities. You might have question that we won't know the answer to in the UWE office, but we can find out and get back to you with answers.

Q: Who should I contact if I have more questions or need more information?

A: Contact your UW 4-H Educator in your county. You can call the UW Extension office or email them.

Animal Ownership Paperwork





Market Beef, Swine, Goat, Lamb (not Breeding)

<u>Ear Tag:</u> put in by Fair Board at an official tagging event, they report it to the Ext. Office for you, you DO NOT have to record it in 4HOnline <u>Beef & Sheep:</u> must have an official change of ownership paper at Fair



Horse

<u>IDs</u>: on paper this year, contact your horse leader for more info <u>Safety Certification</u>: meeting with your horse leader, they fill out form, contact horse leader for more info



Dog

<u>ID</u>: paper form, get from dog leader or Ext Office, return to dog leader or Ext Office

<u>Shot Records</u>: official record from your vet, you can email, fax, mail, or drop them off at the Ext. Office



Rabbits

Tattoo in the left ear. Use any number you want. Use a sharpie or tattoo gun



Cats & Poultry

Fair Superintendents may ask you for applicable shot/vaccine records at Fair
