Amended Leader's Council Meeting Minutes

Funding: Leaders Council Checking: \$23,602.73, Leaders Council Savings: \$865.88 (Dormant), Liability Account: \$13,540.58, Endowment Account: \$28,167.05

Updates: **Horse** - Horse Barn on fairgrounds has been taken down, old wood is for sale, supplies were being ordered for new barn until coronavirus restrictions hit; **Shooting Sports** -National Shoot canceled, State shoot still on, county shoot maybe, Rawlins & Savery archery purchased new 3D targets & block targets; **Livestock**- Many shows are going virtual this year, so stay tuned!

Old Business: Jr Livestock Promotion/Thank You letters: There are so many people who show such great support to our members at fair time. Especially now, these supporters should be thanked and recognized. Linda Kraft asked Emily to create a master spreadsheet of sale buyers and ad buyers and share it as a google doc. Clubs will be assigned businesses to write thank you/invitation letters to and Emily will share UW 4-H letterhead for those letters.

New Business: UW Extension has given each county \$2,900 to spend on 4-H project development by mid-May. Emily wanted project leader's input on what tools they need. Are there popular projects that need more equipment? Marla would like something to teach her members about parasites, particularly cat parasites. That question always comes up during showmanship. Amy will talk to Chad and Ashlea and see if any of the dog equipment needs updated/replaced. Having a storage shed for the dog agility course instead of a trailer would be nice. Marla mentioned many kids are into robotics and we don't have any equipment. Linda agreed and also asked about getting things for projects that have just a few members that need interest built. What can we get for visual arts and photography? Even without leaders if we could promote projects by letting members know that things are available. Other projects like that are sport fishing and wildlife and hunting, woodworking.

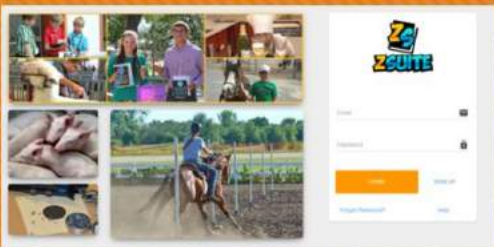

Educational-Opportunity

Examples:

Leadership

Examples:

- Plan & lead an activity for your club during a virtual meeting
- Contact club members to check in and see how they're doing
- Plan your club's next community service



Community Service

Examples:

- Club writes thank-you cards to community health-care workers
- Club sews masks together, separately
- Club runs errands/cleaned yard for elderly, housebound neighbors
- Vote to donate money to Red Cross, local hospital, etc.

Club Meetings, Ed-Ops, practices, clinics, shows, jackpots. They are all going to look different for some of this year. That doesn't mean they don't count!

○ **Out of State/State-Wide 4-H Virtual Learning Activities:** List these under "COUNTY 4-H OPPORTUNITIES". (We know they aren't strictly Carbon County things, but you participated in them while you were in Carbon County!)

○ **Virtual Livestock Shows:** these go under "EXHIBITS" in your project report. (You do not have to have won an award to have exhibited your project.)

○ **Virtual Project Meetings with Leaders from Other Counties:** you don't have to record these, they are for you and your learning. We don't ask you to normally record the project meetings you attend with your regular leader.

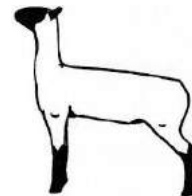

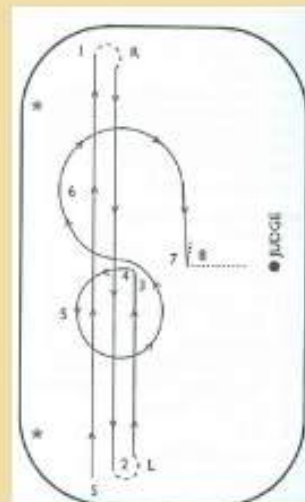
