

- 2. Mail the sale sheet to the business or scan and email it. In your email or cover letter include the following:
- Introduce yourself name & 4-H club
- Why Sending Email/Letter To sell fairbook ads
- Refer to their ad last year

"You had an ad last year and it was (size) 1/2 page. The cost was \$65 and was in color. We can do color or black and white."

- Past or present 4-H member.
- Attending any in or out of state accredited educational institution of higher learning on a full time basis.
- Application: Carbon County 4-H Foundation Scholarship Form

Carbon County 4-H Foundation- Stallion Service Auction Scholarship – Due April 1st, 2021

- Any senior 4-H member (age 14-18 as of Jan 1st of current year) enrolled in Carbon County school
 who is or has been enrolled in the Carbon County horse program is eligible.
- This scholarship is to any college, university or trade school of the recipient's choice.
- Application: <u>Horse Scholarship, Carbon County 4-H Foundation</u>

Carbon County Stock Grower's Association Scholarship – Due April 1st, 2021

- All applicants must have graduated (or equivalent) from a Carbon County high school.
- All applicants must attend a school of higher learning in Wyoming or bordering state.
- Open to: A) Any student enrolled in a field of agriculture and/or B) Immediate relatives of paid Carbon County Stock Grower members (to included sons, daughters, and grandchildren) wishing to study any field.
- Application: Carbon County Stock Growers Association Scholarship Form

Carbon County Farm Bureau Scholarship #1- Due April 15th, 2021

- Must be graduating from a Carbon County high school.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA, based on a 4.0 system.
- Attend a Wyoming College/University in the upcoming fall semester.
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Farm Bureau "Member" Scholarship #2 – Due April 15th, 2021

- Provide parent's Carbon County Farm Bureau Membership Number
- Be a graduating senior from high school
- Have at least a 3.00 cumulative grade point average, based on a 4.00 system. (Principal must sign to verify cumulative GPA)
- Attend an accredited college, university, or trade school
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Commissioners Scholarships: - Due Last Friday in April (24th), 2021

- Available to Students who plan on attending the University of Wyoming or any Wyoming Community College.
- Is not specific to graduating high school students. Non-traditional students are eligible.
- Must be a resident of Carbon County
- There will be 3 new scholarships and 1 renewal scholarship awarded each year.
