

-As for COVID restrictions on our county's shooting sports program: 4-H has no rules of its own, follow the restrictions of whatever facilities you are using regarding to masks, social distancing, and group numbers

Livestock: There is now a no professional fitting rule at Carbon County Fair. Exact wording will be in the 2021 Fair

VII. Old Business

a.) Enrollments pay scale (\$15 > \$20): Enrollment went up \$8 starting January 1^{st} . There has been no member comment or complaint on it. Louis added that if the \$20 is ever a barrier to anyone joining 4-H, that is what Leader's Council is here for and they would be happy to sponsor members

VIII. New Business

a.) Livestock Education Committee: Emily asked Leader's Council to set aside \$500 towards the creation of a new Livestock Education Committee. The committee would oversee putting on at least one educational event for each species every year. The money would be for bringing in guest speakers, purchasing equipment for clinics, providing prizes and incentives to participants.

-Linda asked how much money the Livestock account currently has, and Emily answered around \$400. Linda moved that the Leader's Council set aside \$600 to make it an even \$1000 to get them started. Louis 2nd, motion passed.





- Attending any in or out of state accredited educational institution of higher learning on a full time basis.

Carbon County 4-H Foundation- Stallion Service Auction Scholarship – Due April 1st, 2021

- Any senior 4-H member (age 14-18 as of Jan 1st of current year) enrolled in Carbon County school
 who is or has been enrolled in the Carbon County horse program is eligible.
- This scholarship is to any college, university or trade school of the recipient's choice.

- Must be graduating from a Carbon County high school.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA, based on a 4.0 system.
- Attend a Wyoming College/University in the upcoming fall semester.
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Farm Bureau "Member" Scholarship #2 – Due April 15th, 2021

- Provide parent's Carbon County Farm Bureau Membership Number
- Be a graduating senior from high school
- Have at least a 3.00 cumulative grade point average, based on a 4.00 system. (Principal must sign to verify cumulative GPA)
- Attend an accredited college, university, or trade school
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Commissioners Scholarships: - Due Last Friday in April (24th), 2021

- Available to Students who plan on attending the University of Wyoming or any Wyoming Community College.
- Is not specific to graduating high school students. Non-traditional students are eligible.




