

- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Farm Bureau "Member" Scholarship #2 - Due April 15th, 2023

- Provide parent's Carbon County Farm Bureau Membership Number
- Be a graduating senior from high school
- Have at least a 3.00 cumulative grade point average, based on a 4.00 system. (Principal must sign to verify cumulative GPA)
- Attend an accredited college, university, or trade school
- Application and Essay must be handwritten, all question answered, and signatures signed.
- Failure to follow application requirements will result in disqualification.

Carbon County Commissioners Scholarships: - Due Last Friday in April (28th), 2023

- Available to Students who plan on attending the University of Wyoming or any Wyoming Community College.
- Is not specific to graduating high school students. Non-traditional students are eligible.

Sunday, November 13, was a cold, but sunny day for the 4-H turkey shoot fundraiser. A dedicated group of shooters, often whole families, competed throughout the day. The winner of each round took home a frozen turkey. A raffle drawing was also held for the six-rifle raffle, an additional fundraising effort. The money received is used to purchase ammunition, targets, clay pigeons, and other supplies for the 4-H shooting practices.

The first-place drawing in the rifle raffle was for a Ruger model 77 .300 Win Mag. That was won by Matt Fierge of Craig, Colo. Nathone Adams was the winner of the seconddrawn ticket, and he won the Delta AR-15 .223. The Benelli Nova 12-gauge pump shotgun was won by Michael Bingham of Craig, Colo. Dave Allen was another winner, with the sixth-drawn ticket for the Stoeger 3000 12-gauge pump shotgun. The shooting sports leaders, members, and parents would like to thank everyone who purchased raffle tickets.


