



Good record keeping is a skill you will use your entire life. AND, believe it or not, it CAN be fun!

4-H Record Books serve a variety of purposes in the 4-H Program. While society has changed, the goals of teaching record-keeping to youth remain the same:

- 4-H Record Books give members an opportunity to reflect on their yearly work. They document their skill development, learning experiences, achievement, and growth.
- 4-H Record Books encourage members to set goals and develop plans to meet those goals.
- Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where 4-H members record projects and club work. Records management (RM) is an industry-standard practice of identifying, creating, classifying, archiving, and preserving records.
- The 4-H Record Book is an excellent tool to use when applying for college, programs, jobs, and scholarships.
- 4-H Record Books are an educational component of the 4-H Youth Development Program and are an excellent way to complete your 4-H project.

Carbon County 4-H does not require members to complete a Record Book to complete their 4-H project. HOWEVER, many of our clubs require their members to complete a record book as a requirement of belonging to that club!



DONOR HEIFER PROGRAM

- 1. ANY 4-H OR FFA MEMBER PASSED THEIR 13TH BIRTHDAY, BUT NOT THEIR 17TH BIRTHDAY AS OF 1/1/2023 IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE CARBON COUNTY HEIFER PROGRAM IF THEY HAVE SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED A 4-H OR FFA BEEF, SHEEP, SWINE, GOAT OR HORSE PROJECT. IF A CALF IS RECEIVED,
- 2. THOSE RECEIVING A HEIFER ARE EXPECTED TO SHOW THEIR ANIMAL AND OFFSPRING AT THE 2024 AND 2025 CARBON COUNTY FAIR.
- A DRAWING WILL BE HELD TO DETERMINE THE MATCH BETWEEN THE MEMBER AND THE DONOR.
- 4. THOSE RECEIVING HEIFERS MUST FEED THEM AS A BREEDING BEEF PROJECT DURING THE 2023—2024 PROJECT YEARS AND SHOW THEM AT FAIR AS SUCH.
- 5. FEEDING WILL BE UNDER THE DIRECTION OF THE FAIR BOARD MEMBERS, FFA ADVISOR, UW PROGRAM ASSOCIATE OR OTHER PERSON(S) AS THE BOARD SEES FIT.
- 6. A WRITTEN REPORT WILL BE WRITTEN EACH MONTH ON THE PROGRESS OF THE HEIFER AND HER CALF AND WILL BE SENT TO THE DONOR(S) DURING EACH OF THE PROJECT YEARS. THE LETTERS MUST BE SENT TO THE CARBON COUNTY FAIR BOARD, P.O. BOX 1414, RAWLINS, WY 82301—1414 WITH A STAMPED ENVELOPE ADDRESSED TO THE DONOR. THE FAIR BOARD WILL THEN FORWARD THE LETTERS TO THE DONORS.
- 7. EACH MEMBER AND ONE PARENT OR GUARDIAN MUST SIGN THE ATTACHED AGREEMENT BEFORE APPLICATION CAN BE MADE TO THE HEIFER PROGRAM.
- 8.IF MORE APPLICATIONS ARE RECEIVED THAN DONORS AVAILABLE, YOUNGER MEMBERS WILL BE PLACED ON THE ALTERNATE LIST. THESE MEMBERS WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR FUTURE PROGRAMS.

The NILE is proud to offer 4-H and FFA members the opportunity to participate in a multiple contests this fall! Returning is the Livestock and Horse Evaluation Contests, along with the FFA Sales & Service Contest. Returning this year, is the Meat Evaluation and Veterinary Science contests.

All contests will be held over the course of two days: Monday, October 14 and Tuesday, October 15. 4-H and FFA members from across Montana, surrounding states, and Canada travel to Billings for one of the largest youth gatherings across the region!

HORSE EVALUATION: 9 a.m. - Tuesday, October 15

Back after a 10+ year break, we're excited to offer a Horse Evaluation Contest for 4-H and FFA members. Students will gain new insights into equine science by evaluating and ranking horses based on breed characteristics, conformation, and performance. Participants will then defend their decisions through oral reasons.

Each team is made up of four (4) members, with the option of two (2) alternates for up to six (6) members per team. The top four (4) scores will count toward the team scores. Individual fees will apply for the two (2) alternates. A maximum of twelve (12) members per county/chapter will be allowed to judge.

The NILE offers four (4) divisions:

- Sr FFA Team (Jr & Sr in High School)
- Jr FFA Team (7th Grade Sophomore)
- Sr 4-H Team (14-18 years of age as of Oct 1, 2024)
- Jr 4-H Team (8-13 years of age as of Oct 1, 2024)

Cost is \$75 per team or \$25 per individual.

Registration deadline is Tuesday, October 1st. Please visit <u>judgingcard.com</u> to register. For 4-H teams without a Judging Card account, please call the NILE Office at 406-256-2499 to register. All registration fees must be paid by **October 1st** - online payment or check accepted - sorry, no COD's.
