Create, not limit, opportunities for ALL youth, while using the "do-reflect-apply" model, and to provide oversight, ensure resources & set direction.


2018 Council Goals


- Provide project learning opportunities through workshops, clinics or by offering other resources.

Please join the council at their monthly meetings typically held on second Thursday of the month at 6PM in the Extension Office meeting room.




