To the Johnson County 4-H Community,

Although we all are seeing the impacts of the economic down turn the 4-H Council's letter requesting community donations for the 4-H program along with the 4-H Carnival experienced a similar level of support for the JC 4-H Council. The council will be able to continue to operate programs at current levels and provide awards and premiums for the 4-H youth at the Fair. These donations coming into the 4-H office ensures our youth a quality and rewarding 4-H experience, included this year was a \$3,500 grant received from the Johnson County Recreation District for 4-H Mountain Camp Shooting Sports.

Funding for 4-H projects allows our leaders to conduct many learning experiences and youth to attend contests in the month of June we had many. We started with Fabric and Fashion leaders offering an activity every day during the first week when school ended including the annual buymanship trip. Next came several camps, contests, workshops, and the County Shoot. JC youth went to the UW Livestock judging camp, Youth Hunter Education Challenge, the 4-H Showcase Showdown, rabbit clinic, a foods workshop was scheduled, and the first annual Northern Wyoming Livestock Judging Contest in Buffalo on June 24<sup>th</sup>.

At Showcase Showdown the nine JC youth attending from Johnson County excelled. The junior Produce Evaluation team (vegetable judging) finished as state champions for the third year in a row. Seven of the nine vegetable judges earned placing ribbons. The Hippology (horse knowledge) junior team finished as state champions for the first time and the Dog Skil-a-thon team finished as reserve champions. Along with all the contests, the youth at Showcase Showdown enjoyed time in the UW dorms and other fun activities including a dance and the planetarium.

As we run from 4-H event to 4-H event watching the JC youth involvement, it is plain to see how committed volunteer leaders evoke a sense of community pride and instill a strong set of values in the JC 4-H youth. 4-H is about positive youth development. Although there are challenges in making things happen with a program lead by youth and volunteers, the volunteer leaders of 4-H in JC know their work with the 4-H kids is what makes the program respected throughout the state.






